Section 3 Policy

- E. Maintain a list of those persons who have identified themselves as Section 3 residents and contact those persons when hiring/training opportunities are available through either the Grant Recipient or contractors.
- F. Require that all Prime contractors and subcontractors with contracts over \$100,000 commit to this plan as part of their contract work. Monitor the contractors' performance with respect to meeting Section 3 requirements and require that they submit reports as may be required by HUD or TDA to the Grant Recipient.
- G. Submit reports as required by HUD or TDA regarding contracting with Section 3 businesses and/or employment as they occur; and submit reports within 20 days of calendar year end which identify and quantify Section 3 businesses and employees.

Section 504 Grievance Procedure

The City of Socorro has adopted an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development regulations (24 CFR 8.4(a) implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended (29 USC 794)). Section 504 states, in part that, "No otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall, solely by reason of his handicap, be excluded from the participation in, denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance..."

Complaints should be addressed to: <u>Human Resources Director Rosio Marin</u> who has been designated to coordinate Section 504 compliance efforts.

A complaint should be filed in writing or verbally, contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations.

A complaint should be filed within ten (10) <u>working</u> days after the complainant becomes aware of the alleged violation. (Processing of allegations of discrimination occurring before this grievance procedure was in place will be considered on a case-by-case basis).

An investigation, as may be appropriate, shall follow a filing of a complaint. The investigation will be conducted by <u>Human Resources Director Rosio Marin</u>. Informal but thorough investigations will afford all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint.

A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and description of resolution, if any, shall be issued by <u>Human Resources Director Rosio Marin</u> and a copy forwarded to the complainant no later than ten (10) <u>working</u> days after its filing.

The Section 504 coordinator shall maintain the files and records of the City of Socorro relating to the complaints files.

The complainant can request a reconsideration of the case in instances where he or she is dissatisfied with the resolution. The request for reconsideration should be made within ten working days to the City of Socorro.

The right of a person to a prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint filed hereunder shall not be impaired by the person's pursuit of other remedies such as the filing of a Section 504 complaint with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Utilization of this grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies.

These rules shall be construed to protect the substantive rights of interested persons, to meet appropriate due process standards and assure that the City of Socorro complies with Section 504 and HUD regulations.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING between the NATIONAL TRUST FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION and

The City of Socorro, Texas regarding RIO VISTA FARM HISTORIC DISTRICT

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made and entered into by and among the NATIONAL TRUST FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION and the CITY OF SOCORRO, TEXAS for the purpose of establishing cooperative efforts to preserve and reuse of Rio Vista Farm Historic District in Socorro, Texas.

- The National Trust for Historic Preservation ("National Trust") is a privately-funded nonprofit organization working to save America's historic places to enrich our future. The National Trust has nominated the Rio Vista Farm Historic District to its national portfolio of "National Treasures."
- The City of Socorro, Texas has two recreation centers that provide various programs, activities, and amenities to constituents. The mission of each recreation center is to preserve and maintain facilities and programs that grant the citizens of Socorro holistic opportunities of human development and wellness. The Rio Vista Farm Historic District is a historic quadrangle complex that is now occupied by the Rio Vista Community Center and is located at 901 North Rio Vista Road in Socorro, Texas.

The parties to this MOU are referred to collectively as the Rio Vista Historic District Working Group ("Working Group").

PURPOSE

The purpose of the MOU between the National Trust and the City of Socorro is to create a dedicated partnership for the rehabilitation and reuse plan for the historic sites of the Rio Vista Capital Project. This partnership is designed for the coordinated efforts for the Historic Rio Vista Farm Historic District. The parties have drafted a shared objective as follows:

"Both entities seek to transform the Rio Vista Farm Historic District into a well preserved and engaging historic site with strong community support, and produce a sustainable community-focused reuse that can serve as a model for other rural, and historically significant Latino resources."

AGREEMENT

In consideration of the foregoing, and in pursuit of their common interests, the members of the Working Group agree to establish cooperative efforts in the following ways:

1. WORK PLAN. The parties shall develop a joint Rio Vista Farm Historic District project work plan with a timeline that shall be managed by the National Trust. The Work

Plan may be amended by the parties from time to time to memorialize changes to the tasks or timeline. Elements may include:

- Identification of urgent preservation priorities;
- Statement of Work Group goals;
- Identification of potential use scenarios;
- Identification of a preferred use alternative;
- Capital expenditure estimates;
- Preliminary operating budget;
- Fundraising plan;
- Other elements as needed.
- 2. MUTUAL COOPERATION. Each party agrees to cooperate with each other on all matters related to completion of the Work Plan.
- 3. PROJECT LIAISONS. Each member of the Working Group shall maintain a Rio Vista Farm Historic District project liaison to ensure communication, foster a positive working relationship, and facilitate the implementation of this MOU. The liaisons will also troubleshoot to resolve any complications, problems, or disputes that arise on a timely basis.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES.

The National Trust for Historic Preservation: The National Trust shall include the Rio Vista Historic District among its national portfolio of "National Treasures" until at least September 30, 2018. This National Treasure will develop a strategy for the City of Socorro that seeks to stabilize the historic structures at the Rio Vista Farm Historic District and promote a model for the sustainability and management of rural and Latino historic sites nationally. Sehila Mota Casper, or other representative designated by the National Trust, shall act as National Trust project liaison and manage the implementation of the Work Plan.

The City of Socorro:

As owners of the Rio Vista Recreation Center, the City of Socorro shall work in partnership to achieve agreed upon goals. The city shall share available and pertinent data on complex usage, costs, management and preservation plans, and best practices to assure the success of efforts to preserve and reuse Rio Vista's structures. The City of Socorro will facilitate access to the complex, use of the complex when necessary, and provide local communication and engagement with city staff, volunteers and potential local funders to ensure a high level of accountability. Victor Reta or other representative designated by the City of Socorro will act as the project liaison.

- 5. SPECIFIC INTER-ORGANIZATIONAL AGREEMENTS. The parties may develop specific agreements to implement this MOU. The parties shall pursue these agreements, subject to review and approval by the parties and other authorities as needed.
- 6. COST ALLOCATION. Each party shall bear its own costs and responsibility for accounting in connection with the MOU and Work Plan's obligations. It is agreed that

- each party's obligation to carry out the work plan is subject to available funding.
- 7. FUNDING/FUNDRAISING. As set forth in the Work Plan, the parties will participate in fundraising in support of the preservation of the Rio Vista Farm Historic District to the best of their efforts. This may include prospect identification, solicitation strategies, and funding requests. The parties furthermore agree to collaborate on opportunities for revenue generation and a sustainability management plans to benefit the Rio Vista Community Center.
- 8. COMMUNICATION. The parties agree to coordinate media strategies and other external communications concerning the Rio Vista Farm Historic District Work Plan and preservation project. In addition, the parties commit to communicate as necessary to identify potential opportunities and problems associated with the implementation of the Work Plan. The parties to this MOU will participate in scheduled meetings to review the Work Plan and provide updates on progress.
- 9. MEDIA/MARKETING. The parties agree to collaborate on media outreach and share marketing and promotional ideas, plans, and programs. The National Treasure public announcement and launch is currently under development, and collaboration of this project will remain <u>CONFIDENTIAL</u> until the Working Group jointly releases the project publicly on an agreed upon date.
- 10. AMENDMENTS. The parties to this MOU may amend it upon written agreement by all the parties. This MOU shall only be amended in a writing signed by all parties.
- 11. PARTY RESPONSIBILITY. Each party shall be responsible for its own acts or omissions.
- 12. DURATION. This MOU shall apply for the duration of the Work Plan, and shall terminate upon the Work Plan's completion on September 30, 2018, or by termination of the MOU.
- 13. INCORPORATIONS. Any extensions, amendments, and/or modifications may be incorporated into the next fully executed and signed Agreement.
- 14. TERMINATION. Any party to this MOU may terminate it by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other parties, provided that all parties to the MOU consult during the period prior to termination to seek agreement on amendments or other actions that would avoid termination. If within thirty (30) days (or other time period agreed to by all parties) an amendment cannot be reached, any party may immediately terminate this MOU upon written notification to the other parties.
- 15. EXECUTION. This MOU may be executed in counterparts. Each counterpart copy shall constitute the MOU, and all of the counterpart copies shall constitute one fully executed agreement. This MOU shall become effective upon the date of the last signature. The National Trust will ensure that each party is provided with a copy of the

fully executed MOU.

- 16. GOVERNING LAW. This MOU shall be governed by the applicable laws of Texas. Should any provision of this MOU be found void or unenforceable, it shall be severable from the rest of the MOU and the remaining terms shall be enforced as if the unenforceable term had not existed.
- 17. ASSIGNMENT. None of the parties may assign any rights or obligations granted to it by this MOU to a third party without prior written approval of the other parties. The terms of this MOU shall be binding on all successors and assigns of the parties to the MOU.
- 18. NO JOINT LIABILITY. Except as specifically provided herein, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as giving any party the right or ability to bind the other or to create any joint liability with regard to, or as a result of, the activities undertaken to implement this Agreement.
- 19. WAIVER. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, no party waives any of the privileges and immunities from liability, exemption from laws, ordinances, rules, and/or other benefits that it would otherwise have.
- 20. COMMITMENT TO PARTNERSHIP. By signing, the representatives identified below acknowledge that they understand and agree with this collaborative Agreement and have the authority to and do commit their respective organizations to the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement, and agree for their respective successors and assigns to be bound by its terms and conditions.

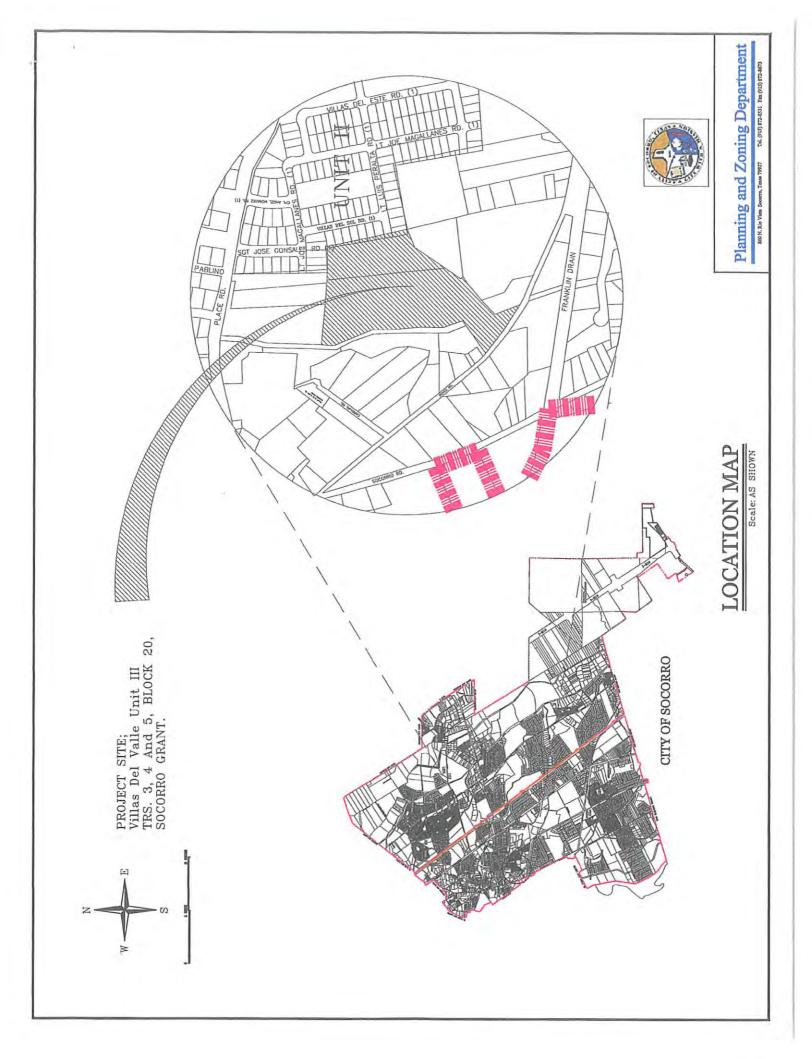
