

Financial Statement Highlights

Statement of Financial Position

- Total Assets decreased by \$3 million from 2014.
 - This decrease can be attributed to a increase in allowance for doubtful accounts related to Municipal Court Receivable (about \$1.8 mil decrease) AND decrease in cash not related to capital asset additions (about \$0.9 mil decrease).
- Total Liabilities decreased by \$1.3 million from 2014.
 - This decrease is attributed mainly to the decrease in bonds payable.

Financial Statement Highlights

Statement of Activities

- Revenue and Support
 - FY 2015 total revenue was \$9.1 million compared to \$9.2 for FY 2014, a decrease of \$100k

 - Construction in progress additions of \$2,173,461 and deletions of \$63,243 were not identified in initial list provided
 - Eleven assets which were fully depreciated in prior years had a zero balance in accumulated depreciation. The total amount of the assets was \$161,302
 - A bus in the amount of \$57,900 was incorrectly listed as being an addition for the fiscal year 2015, however this bus was not obtained by the City until after fiscal year end
 - A capital asset inventory was initiated at the City, however no written documentation indicated that the final list was approved by management or compared to the listing of capital assets in the City's software

- · Significant Deficiency
 - · Special Revenue Restricted Equity
 - No process in place to track the restricted revenue and expenditures by type of restriction
- · Other Matters
 - · Unclaimed Checks
 - Stale dated check which are over 3 years old at year end. These amounts are required to be reported to the Texas Unclaimed Property Division.
 - · Expenditures in Excess of Budget
 - Expenditures in excess of approved budget for departments/functions in the General Fund, Special Revenue Fund, and the Capital Projects Fund

SUMMARY:

The property matter of this request is located 485 feet north from the intersection of Rio Vista and Rio Vista Rd. This property has an estimated area of 159,556 sq. ft. (3.6629 acres), owned by Angel & Consuelo Perez, 216 S. Maryland St., El Paso, TX 79905.

BACKGROUND:

According to our Future Land Use map, the projected land use for this property is: Commercial. According to the Flood Insurance Rate Maps, the referenced property lies within an area determined to be inside a flood plain, more particularly described as **Zone AO**; this area has a 1% or greater chance of shallow flooding each year, usually in the form of sheet flow, with an average depth ranging from 1 to 3 feet (Community Panel # 480212 0236-B / FEMA, September 4, 1991).

The current use of the property is: Commercial (Lienzo Charro / Rodeo Arena)

The proposed use of the property: Lienzo Charro with C.U.P for Beer & Wine.

Tentatively, improvements in this property were done in 1994.

This case was tabled on July 7, 2016 to investigate if the property had a public right-of-way. Based on the information that was recorded with the Socorro Grant plat of 1927, the frontage of the property is considered a public right-of-way. Today, this access would be considered a substandard road. Nonetheless, it is still a public access.







Sec. 46-53. - Public hearing and notice requirements.

- (a) The planning and zoning commission shall hold a public hearing on all requests for zone changes and initial zonings and shall submit a report of the hearing along with its recommendations to the city council for final action. A planning and zoning commission recommendation for approval of a requested zone change or initial zoning shall be placed on the city council consent agenda for passage unless removed from the consent agenda by a two-thirds vote of the city council, or unless appealed to the city council.
- (b) Upon receiving an application for a zoning change, zoning text amendment, future land use plan change, conditional use permit, annexation, or initial zoning, the planning and zoning commission shall review the application in conjunction with the standards set forth in this section. After due investigation and review, if the application is tentatively approved, a public hearing shall be authorized and conducted as provided in this section.
- (c) The planning and zoning commission shall hold a public hearing on the application within 60 days after its receipt. Written notice of the hearing shall be given to the applicant and to all persons who own property within 200 feet of the proposed conditional use. A notice of the hearing shall be published at least 15 days prior to the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the city. All notices shall be at the applicant's expense.
- (d) Within 30 days after the public hearing, the conditional use permit shall be granted or denied. In granting the conditional use permit, the planning and zoning commission shall be authorized to permit the use applied for the subject to such reasonable conditions as it may impose. These conditions may contain such requirements for improving, maintaining, operating, and screening the condition use as will protect the character of the surrounding property. City council has final permit approval authority and may use the recommendations of the planning and zoning commission to determine whether to approve or deny the application.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this announcement is to solicit applications for projects to local law enforcement agencies to upgrade technology infrastructure to allow for and support Incident Reporting to the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS). This program is a partnership between the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division (CJD) and DPS. Funds may be used for activities that further the reporting of NIBRS data to DPS.

BACKGROUND

The Police Department has a limited computer access and its equipment and software make imposses an additional barrier to comply with reporting requirements.

STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE

Uniform Crime Reporting gathers crime data from law enforcement agencies for statistical analysis. Currently, there are two distinct methods for reporting data: the original model built in 1927, known as Summary Reporting (SRS) and Incident Reporting, known as National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). In comparing the two data collection methodologies, it is readily apparent that NIBRS provides a deeper, richer data set. Summary Reporting tallies 10 offenses, also known as the index crimes, homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, etc., as well as arrests made and property stolen. Incident Reporting collects data on 24 offense types comprised of 52 distinct offenses and agencies report based upon the specific incident that includes data related not only to offenses and arrests, but also to location, victim and offender data, etc.

PROGRAM - FUNDED STATE AND LOCAL TASK FORCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DRUG ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION AND THE SOCORRO POLICE DEPARTMENT FISCAL YEAR 2017

This agreement is made this 1st day of October 2016, between the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (hereinafter referred to as "DEA") and Socorro Police Department (hereinafter referred to as "SPD"). The DEA is authorized to enter into this cooperative agreement concerning the use and abuse of controlled substances under the provisions of 21 U.S.C. § 873.

WHEREAS there is evidence that trafficking in narcotics and dangerous drugs exists in the area and that such illegal activity has a substantial and detrimental effect on the health and general welfare of the people of El Paso Division Office area of responsibility (AOR), the parties hereto agree to the following:

- 1. The DEA, El Paso Division, Office of the Assistant Special Agent in Charge (hereinafter referred to as the Task Force) will perform the activities and duties described below:
 - a. disrupt the illicit drug traffic in the El Paso Division Office AOR by immobilizing targeted violators and trafficking organizations;
 - b. gather and report intelligence data relating to trafficking in narcotics and dangerous drugs; and
 - c. conducts undercover operations where appropriate and engages in other traditional methods of investigation in order that the Task Force's activities will result in effective prosecution before the courts of the United States and the State of Texas.
- 2. To accomplish the objectives of the Task Force, the SPD agrees to detail one experienced officer for a period of not less than two years. During this period of assignment, the SPD officer will be under the direct supervision and control of DEA supervisory personnel assigned to the Task Force.
- 3. The SPD officer assigned to the Task Force shall adhere to DEA policies and procedures. Failure to adhere to DEA policies and procedures shall be grounds for dismissal from the Task Force.
- 4. The SPD officer assigned to the Task Force shall be deputized as Task Force Officer of DEA pursuant to 21 U.S.C. Section 878.
- 5. To accomplish the objectives of the Task Force, DEA will assign one Special Agent to the Task Force. DEA will also, subject to the availability of annually appropriated funds or any

continuing resolution thereof, provide necessary funds and equipment to support the activities of the DEA Special Agent and SPD officer assigned to the Task Force. This support will include office space, office supplies, travel funds, funds for the purchase of evidence and information, investigative equipment, training, and other support items.

6. During the period of assignment to the Task Force, the SPD will remain responsible for establishing the salary and benefits, including overtime, of the officers assigned to the Task Force, and for making all payments due them. DEA will, subject to availability of funds, reimburse the SPD for overtime payments made by it to SPD officer assigned to the Task Force for overtime, up to a sum equivalent to 25 percent of the salary of a GS-12, step 1, (RUS) Federal employee (currently \$17,753.00), per officer.

Note: Task Force Officer's overtime "shall not include any costs for benefits, such as retirement, FICA, and other expenses."

- 7. In no event will the SPD charge any indirect cost rate to DEA for the administration or implementation of this agreement.
- 8. The SPD shall maintain on a current basis complete and accurate records and accounts of all obligations and expenditures of funds under this agreement in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and instructions provided by DEA to facilitate on-site inspection and auditing of such records and accounts.
- 9. The SPD shall permit and have readily available for examination and auditing by DEA, the United States Department of Justice, the Comptroller General of the United States, and any of their duly authorized agents and representatives, any and all records, documents, accounts, invoices, receipts or expenditures relating to this agreement. The SPD shall maintain all such reports and records until all litigation, claim, audits and examinations are completed and resolved, or for a period of three years after termination of this agreement, whichever is later.
- 10. The SPD shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, and all requirements imposed by or pursuant to the regulations of the United States Department of Justice implementing those laws, 28 C.F.R. Part 42, Subparts C, F, G, H and I.
- 11. The SPD agrees that an authorized officer or employee will execute and return to DEA the attached OJP Form 4061/6, Certification Regarding Lobbying; Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; and Drug-Free Workplace Requirements. The SPD acknowledges that this agreement will not take effect and no Federal funds will be awarded to the SPD by DEA until the completed certification is received.
- 12. When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations, and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, the SPD shall clearly state: (1) the percentage of the total cost of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money and (2) the dollar amount of Federal funds for the project or program.

13. The term of this agreement shall be effective from the date in paragraph number one until September 30, 2017. This agreement may be terminated by either party on thirty days' advance written notice. Billing for all outstanding obligations must be received by DEA within 90 days of the date of termination of this agreement. DEA will be responsible only for obligations incurred by SPD during the term of this agreement.
