



Executive Summary

The primary function of the Grants & Special Projects Department (GSPD) is to assist City Departments and the City's non-profit partner organization in meeting our City's Mission and Vision to better serve the residents of Socorro, Texas. To this end, the GSPD has identified the following department goals:

- Local Government grant funding and program development
- Non-profit sector development and support
- Economic Development program development and support

The GSPD, which is composed of the City Development Director, one (1) full time Grants Accounting Specialist, and the Economic Recovery Coordinator, spearheads new grant projects and special projects across various City departments, the City's nonprofit partner organization, and small business community. **Department Highlights** during this reporting period (January 1, 2023 to January 31, 2023) include:

Grants Writing/ Administration – Research and coordination to develop nine (9) grant applications via the Office of the Governors for the Socorro Police Department.
 Preparation and submittal of three (3) pre-application to the FY23 Transportation
 Alternatives Program totaling \$39.4 million in funding requests. Preparation and

- submittal of federal financial reports for federally-funded grant projects in coordination with Finance Department.
- ARPA Assisted the I.T. Department in the development of the Broadband Infrastructure
 Project to enhance broadband access at public facilities and parks and the Critical
 Infrastructure Project to create safe spaces at public facilities and parks via a
 centralized camera monitoring system. Continued technical and administrative support
 for twenty-three (23) ARPA Projects totaling \$9,011,025.




Financial Overview

The following is a general overview of the grant funding available to City Departments since the start of the new 2022-2023 fiscal year on October 1st, 2022. The Active Grants Funding table below represents the **net amount** of grant funding available to active grant projects since the start of the new 2022-2023 fiscal year. As of this reporting period, active grant funding

awards total \$5,665,780.97. Please note that this active grant total does not include funding awards to the CSCI nonprofit and does not include transportation project funding received for Arterial 1, Nuevo Hueco Tanks Road, or Bovee and Rio Vista Rd. Bridge Replacement Projects. There was no net increase in active grant funding during this reporting period.




What is a Land Locked Property?

- Landlocked property" is a tract of land that is inaccessible through a public and dedicated road.
- Landlocked property is typically created when a larger tract of land is subdivided into smaller tracts of land. For Socorro: created through the Socorro Land Grant.
- A parcel of land that can only be accessed by crossing another's property. Typically this is achieved through an access easement.
- Access easement is not a public and dedicated road.



How Are Streets Created?

- Sec. 46-626. Structures to have access.
- Every building hereafter erected or moved shall be on a lot with at least 40 feet frontage on, and with vehicular access to, a public street; and all structures shall be so located on lots as to provide safe and convenient vehicular access for servicing, fire protection, and required off-street parking.
- Sec. 38-8.2. Preliminary plat—Plans and data.
- (7) Proposed lot lines and public right-of-way and street widths; indicate roadways intended to be private; locations of planned water wells, reservoirs, and pump stations; location, dimensions, and purpose of all easements, public or private rights-of-way for public services or utilities, and any limitations thereof.
- (3) Street design. Typical cross sections and construction details of proposed streets, and other proposed improvements conforming to city design standards. Traffic volume projections for roadway layouts.




- (a) Street location and arrangement.
 - (1) Streets must conform in character, location, and arrangement to adopted comprehensive plans. The city should be consulted for information regarding applicable plans for areas under design consideration.
 - (2) Proposed street arrangements must provide for the continuation of existing principal streets or appropriate projections thereof if not otherwise governed by an adopted plan as discussed in [subsection (a)(1)] of this section.
 - (4) Alleys are not to be provided where other provisions can be made for adequate and suitable service access.
- (b) Right-of-way and pavement widths minimum standards.
 - (1) Required street right-of-way widths and pavement widths are established in table 38-52.1 and shown on figures 107.1 through 107.4.
 - (2) Access. Private driveway access to single-family development is not permitted on minor arterial or major arterial streets.

SUMMARY

The Grants & Special Projects Department will submit a grant application to the FY 2024 First Responder Mental Health Program requesting funding for professional therapy and counseling, and peer support groups, for peace officers and first responders operating in Socorro, Texas.

STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE

Peace officers and first responders are by default the first individuals at the site of traffic incidents, violent crimes, and medical emergencies. Peace officers and first responders endure long working hours away from family members, under high-stakes stressful conditions, and endure constant exposure to traumatic events and life-threatening situations. A recent study conducted in 2017 showed that as many as 85% of first responders had experienced some symptoms of mental health distress. Furthermore, the high-pace of constant demands on first responders, often means that responders never have enough time or resources to recover between traumatic events (Bentley et al., 2013).

The goal of the First Responder Mental Health Program is to provide services and assistance directly to peace officers and first responders to address direct and indirect trauma that occurs in the course of their normal duties, either as the result of the commission of crimes by other persons or in response to an emergency.

If funded, the City of Socorro will partner with our local mental health authority, Emergence Health Network, to provide high-quality mental health services and assistance to peace officers and first responders. Officers and peace officers will have access to free, confidential mental health services at the individual level, and also via peer support groups, as needed. Positive outcomes expected as a result of this program include; improved access to confidential and specialized mental health services, increased coping mechanisms and strategies, improved morale and productivity, reduced stress, and a reduction of negative attitudes towards counseling and mental health services within the law enforcement department and ultimately, community-wide.

ADDENDUM TO CITY MANAGER EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

The City of Socorro (the "City") and Adriana Rodarte ("City Manager") previously entered into a City Manager Employment Agreement ("Employment Agreement") executed by the parties on January 8, 2021. City and City Manager have agreed to revise the Agreement as follows:

- 6. **Evaluations.** Members of the City Council for the City of Socorro shall provide written evaluations of the City Manager every twelve (12) months. If a City Council member does not provide a written evaluation, it shall not be considered for purposes of Paragraph 8.
- 8. Compensation and Discretionary Bonus. The City agrees to pay the City Manager an annual salary of \$130,001.00. City Manager shall also receive all cost of living pay increases that are applicable to full-time City employees. At the end of the first twelve (12) months of this Agreement, the City Manager shall be eligible for a bonus up to and not to exceed Three Percent (3%) of City Manager's annual salary, which is contingent on the receipt of a favorable written evaluation from City Council. At the end of the second twelve (12) months of this Agreement, the City Manager shall be eligible for a bonus up to and not to exceed Five Percent (5%) of City Manager's annual salary, which is contingent on the receipt of a favorable written evaluation from City Council.

- 10.3 Deleted in its entirety.

It is agreed and acknowledged that the changes to the Agreement as referenced in this Addendum do not alter or change any of the other terms and conditions of the Employment Agreement. Further, City and City Manager consent to all changes to the City Manager Employment Agreement, including to City Manager's base salary.
