What is a Land Locked Property?

- Landlocked property" is a tract of land that is inaccessible through a public and dedicated road.
- Landlocked property is typically created when a larger tract of land is subdivided into smaller tracts of land. For Socorro: created through the Socorro Land Grant.
- A parcel of land that can only be accessed by crossing another's property. Typically this is achieved through an access easement.
- Access easement is not a public and dedicated road.




How Are Streets Created?

• Sec. 46-626. - Structures to have access.

 Every building hereafter erected or moved shall be on a lot with at least 40 feet frontage on, and with vehicular access to, a public street; and all structures shall be so located on lots as to provide safe and convenient vehicular access for servicing, fire protection, and required off-street parking.

• Sec. 38-8.2. Preliminary plat—Plans and data.

- (7) Proposed lot lines and public right-of-way and street widths; indicate roadways intended to be private; locations of planned water wells, reservoirs, and pump stations; location, dimensions, and purpose of all easements, public or private rights-of-way for public services or utilities, and any limitations thereof.
- (3) Street design. Typical cross sections and construction details of proposed streets, and other proposed improvements conforming to city design standards. Traffic volume projections for roadway layouts.




How Are Streets Created?

Sec. 38-52.3. - Street design standards—General planning.

- (a) Street location and arrangement.
 - (1) Streets must conform in character, location, and arrangement to adopted comprehensive plans. The city should be consulted for information regarding applicable plans for areas under design consideration.
 - (2) Proposed street arrangements must provide for the continuation of existing principal streets or appropriate projections thereof if not otherwise governed by an adopted plan as discussed in [subsection (a)(1)] of this section.
 - (4) Alleys are not to be provided where other provisions can be made for adequate and suitable service access.
- (b) Right-of-way and pavement widths minimum standards.
 - (1) Required street right-of-way widths and pavement widths are established in table <u>38-52.1</u> and shown on figures 107.1 through 107.4.
 - (2) Access. Private driveway access to single-family development is not permitted on minor arterial or major arterial streets.
















STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE

Peace officers and first responders are by default the first individuals at the site of traffic incidents, violent crimes, and medical emergencies. Peace officers and first responders endure long working hours away from family members, under high-stakes stressful conditions, and endure constant exposure to traumatic events and life-threatening situations. A recent study conducted in 2017 showed that as many as 85% of first responders had experienced some symptoms of mental health distress. Furthermore, the high-pace of constant demands on first responders, often means that responders never have enough time or resources to recover between traumatic events (Bentley et al., 2013).

The goal of the First Responder Mental Health Program is to provide services and assistance directly to peace officers and first responders to address direct and indirect trauma that occurs in the course of their normal duties, either as the result of the commission of crimes by other persons or in response to an emergency.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Workforce Solutions Borderplex

City of Socorro (Socorro Business HUB)

Workforce Solutions Borderplex (WSB) is a regional government entity and non-profit organization established to act as an arm of the State of Texas to carry out the governmental functions of workforce development. WSB is certified by the Texas Workforce Commission as the local workforce development board for the six counties of far West Texas (Brewster, Culberson, El Paso, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, and Presidio) encompassed within the Workforce region. WSB's functions include overseeing integrated workforce training, education, and related services and programs for the area.

WSB provides a wide range of assistance to job seekers, including youth, underemployed, unemployed, and displaced workers in the six-county region along the U.S.-Mexico border from El Paso to the east of Presidio County. Services include but are not limited to, job search activities, career counseling, training assistance, job prep activities, placement assistance, and access to technology resources. WSB also assists qualifying families who require childcare to work or attend school/training by providing childcare subsidies. WSB also assists employers with services, including assessment, pre-screening, recruitment screening, and testing.

The following Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) indicates a voluntary agreement and sets forth the terms of the agreement between WSB and City of Socorro (Socorro Business HUB) regarding the workforce services administered by WSB. This MOU outlines the responsibilities and commitments of the parties to serve WSB during the term of this agreement.

I. Purpose of Agreement

It is the purpose of this agreement to establish a cooperative and mutually beneficial relationship between the parties and to set forth the relative responsibilities of the parties as they relate to the workforce services provided to Socorro Business HUB.

II. Duration of Agreement

The Agreement will commence on March 6, 2023, and will be reviewed annually, remaining in full force and effect until March 5, 2026, for a (3) three-year term, upon satisfactory performance, need, and unless the Agreement is canceled by the parties in accordance with the terms set forth herein. This agreement supersedes all previously signed MOUs for the Socorro Business HUB.

III. Program Description

Socorro Business Hub is an online resource community that connects your small businesses to other entrepreneurs, resource partners, and business opportunities. The E.G. Chayo Apodaca Community Center serves as a facility that connects local businesses to business grants, loans, meetings, networking events, and resources. In partnership with WSB /Business Services, WSB will provide services to the community of Socorro.

IV. General Provisions

It is understood by the parties that each will fulfill its responsibilities under this agreement in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations governing their activities. Nothing in this agreement is intended to negate or otherwise render ineffective any such provisions or operating procedures. If at any time either party is unable to perform its functions under this Agreement consistent with such party's statutory and regulatory mandates, then either party may terminate this Agreement upon providing the other party with written notice.

V. Responsibilities of the Parties under the Agreement

- a. WSB will:
 - Coordinate with Socorro Business HUB staff to provide assistance and visit local businesses in the surrounding area.
 - Provide a menu of WSB business services for local businesses and employers.
 - Maintain access to WSB staff to provide business services or other employment-related program services as needed.
 - Provide support to customers needing assistance with business services Candidate search assistance, Work in Texas, and other related WSB services that are available to the community.
 - Leverage the necessary WSB departments to ensure clients are assisted.
 - Maintain tracking and service delivery for customers that are served at the location.
 - Provide WSB services on Tuesdays & Thursdays, 8:00 am 5:00 pm at the E.G. Chayo Apodaca Community Center, with the flexibility to accommodate hours based on customer demand.
 - Perform assessment for possible eligibility into WSB programs that help remove employment barriers.
 - Assist Socorro Business HUB with hosting WSB-specialized workshops for the local community.
 - Connect local community partners to Socorro Business HUB and the local community.

b. Socorro Business HUB will:

- Provide office space for WSB staff to meet with residents and businesses needing services.
- Provide meeting room space for hosting WSB workshops, interview rooms, and events.
- Provide referrals to WSB for potential participants that WSB can serve through its various programs and services.
- Retain and secure all records directly related to programming and services in coordination with WSB.
- Establish communication with WSB staff regarding Socorro Business HUB logistics and facilities.
- Constant communication with WSB staff on possible partnership and collaborations opportunities.

• Share contact information for potential employers and community referrals.

c. Both Parties will:

- 1. Comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (PL 88.352), which prohibits discrimination based on race, color, or national origin in programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance.
- 2. Comply with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in programs and activities, public and private, that receive federal financial assistance.
- 3. Comply with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, PL 101-336, 101 Congress, 2nd Session, 104 Stat. 317 (July 26, 1990).
- 4. Comply with the requirements of the Texas Revised Civil Statute 44196b-4, Sections 5.03-5.04, which outlines the workplace and confidentiality guidelines regarding AIDS and HIV.

VI. Allocation of Costs

Except as provided herein, each party will assume full responsibility for their respective costs associated with their performance of the terms of this Agreement.

VII. Insurance Requirement

Not applicable.

VIII. Modification, and Assignment

This agreement may be amended at any time in writing by mutual consent of all parties. Any such modification, amendment, or change of this MOU must be signed by each party to be binding or accomplished as set forth in the Modification and Consensus Process below. The agreement may be canceled by a party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, except where the cancellation is for cause (i.e., a material and significant breach of any of the provisions of this agreement). If cancellation is for cause, it may be canceled upon delivery of written notice to the other party.

Modification.

This MOU may only be modified by mutual agreement in writing by both parties.

Non-Assignment. Except as otherwise indicated herein, no Party may, during the term of this MOU or any renewals or extensions of this MOU, assign or subcontract all or any part of the MOU without prior written consent of all other Parties.

Sovereign Immunity

The Parties stipulate and agree that no provision of, or any part of this MOU or any subsequent amendment will be construed: (1) as a waiver of the doctrine of sovereign immunity or immunity from suit as provided for in the Texas Constitution and the Laws of the State of Texas; (2) to extend liability beyond such liability provided for in the Texas Constitution and the Laws of the State of Texas; or (3) as a waiver of any immunity provided by the 11th Amendment or any other provision of the United States Constitution or any immunity recognized by the courts and the laws of the United States.

IX. Dispute Resolution

All Parties are advised to actively participate in Local negotiations in a good-faith effort to reach an agreement. Any disputes must first be attempted to be resolved informally. Should informal resolution efforts fail, the dispute resolution process must be formally initiated by the petitioner seeking resolution.

X. Process

The petitioner must send a notification to the WSB and all Parties to the MOU regarding the conflict within 108 business days. WSB must place the dispute on the agenda of a special meeting of WSB's Executive Committee. The Executive Committee must attempt to mediate and resolve the dispute. Disputes must be resolved by a 2/3 majority consent of the Executive Committee members present. The decision of the Executive Committee must be final and binding unless such a decision is in contradiction of applicable State and Federal laws or regulations governing the Partner agencies. The right of appeal no longer exists when a decision is final. Additionally, final decisions will not be precedent-setting or binding on future conflict resolutions unless they are officially stated in this procedure. The Executive Committee must provide a written response and dated summary of the proposed resolution to all Parties to the MOU. WSB will contact the petitioner and the appropriate Parties to verify that all agree with the proposed resolution.

XI. Miscellaneous.

Indemnity

WSB AND THE CITY OF SOCORRO AGREE TO INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, AND HOLD- EACH OTHER HARMLESS, THE CITY, AND ITS EMPLOYEES, REPRESENTATIVES, SUCCESSORS, AND ASSIGNS (THE "CITY RELEASEES") FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, CAUSES OF ACTION, LIABILITY, EXPENSES, REASONABLE ATTORNEYS FEES, COSTS, INJURIES, DAMAGE, HARM, OR OTHER LOSS ARISING FROM CLAIMS OF THIRD PARTIES AGAINST WSB RELATED TO THIS MOU, REGARDLESS OF ANY NEGLIGENT CONDUCT OF ANY THE CITY RELEASEES, TO THE PROPORTIONAL EXTENT CAUSED BY THE INTENTIONAL, WILLFUL, OR NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF WSB OR THE BREACH OF ANY TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT BY WSB.

Independent Contractor

WSB agrees that it is an independent contractor with respect to the services provided pursuant to this agreement. Nothing in this agreement will be considered to create the relationship of employer and employee between the parties.

Immunity and Public Records

Both parties reserve, and do not waive, their rights of sovereign immunity and similar rights, and their rights under the Texas Tort Claims Act. No provision of this Agreement imposing any obligation or restriction on either party, not permitted by applicable law will be enforceable. 



ZONING MAP



At the end of the second twelve (12) months of this Agreement, the City Manager shall be eligible for a bonus up to and not to exceed Five Percent (5%) of City Manager's annual salary, which is contingent on the receipt of a favorable written evaluation from City Council.
