# STATUS ON SOCORRO'S FTZ APPLICATION

- City Council approved a resolution on Nov. 3, 2022, to submit FTZ application; and FTZ Board formally docketed in early January 2023.
- Public comment period closed on Mar. 23, 2023, and the Rebuttal period ended on April 3, 2023. No comments were received from any public entity.

This would be achieved by constructing a new four-lane divided roadway. The proposed project would include four travel lanes (two in each direction) with a 16-foot raised median. Shared used paths and parkways are also proposed on each side of the roadway.

**BACKGROUND:** In May 2013, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) El Paso District initiated a Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study within the City of El Paso and surrounding communities to identify the transportation needs within the proposed Border Highway East project area. The PEL study identified operational deficiencies and lack of connectivity to I-10 within City of Socorro city limits. Based on these findings, TxDOT and the City of Socorro have collaborated to further address the transportation needs in the vicinity of the City of Socorro through the proposed Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) project. #### **Executive Summary**

In May 2013, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) El Paso District initiated a Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study within the City of El Paso and surrounding communities to identify the transportation needs within the proposed Border Highway East (BHE) project area. Although this PEL study was not specific to the Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) project, it identified operational deficiencies and lack of connectivity to Interstate Highway 10 (I-10) within City of Socorro city limits. Based on these findings, TxDOT and the City of Socorro have collaborated to further address the transportation needs in the vicinity of the City of Socorro through the proposed Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) project from FM 258 (Socorro Road) to I-10. Three viable alternatives were developed that would improve connectivity and access in the area by offering an alternative route parallel to State Loop 375 (LP 375) and Farm to Market (FM) 1281 (Horizon Boulevard). The study limits for the three alternatives were approximately from Interstate Highway 10 mile marker 39 to mile marker 41. from Sun Park Road to Vianey Road, in Socorro, Texas.

The project is needed to improve mobility and east/west connectivity in the vicinity of the City of Socorro. The purpose of the proposed project is to alleviate the connectivity issues and deficiencies identified in the PEL study. This would be achieved by constructing a new four-lane divided roadway. The proposed project would include four travel lanes (two in each direction) with a 16-foot raised median. Shared used paths and parkways are also proposed on each side of the roadway.

Based on previous studies, three Viable Alternatives were developed to address the purpose and need for the project. Engineering and Environmental constraints were taken into account in the analysis of the three alternatives. Right-of-way acquisition, public input, and construction cost were a few of the factors considered in the comparison of the three viable alternatives. The no build alternative was also included for comparison of the existing condition to the viable alternatives. This document describes this alternative analysis in further detail and provides a recommended alternative selection.

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Appendix A: Arterial 1 Documentation of Virtual Public Meeting Summary

#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

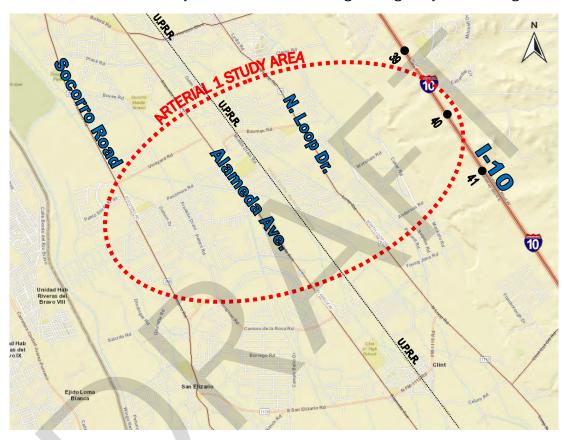


Figure 1: Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) Project Study Area

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and the City of Socorro are proposing the Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) project to address transportation and connectivity needs in the City of Socorro in El Paso County, Texas. The limits of the project are from Farm-to-Market (FM) 258 (Socorro Road) to Interstate Highway 10 (I-10). The proposed study area is provided in **Figure 1**, below. Section 2.0 of this document provides a description of the project, Section 3.0 describes the alternative analysis process, and Section 4.0 provides the proposed recommended Technically Preferred Alternative, which will be carried forward to City Council for additional engineering analysis and design.

#### 2.0 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

#### 2.1 Previous Studies

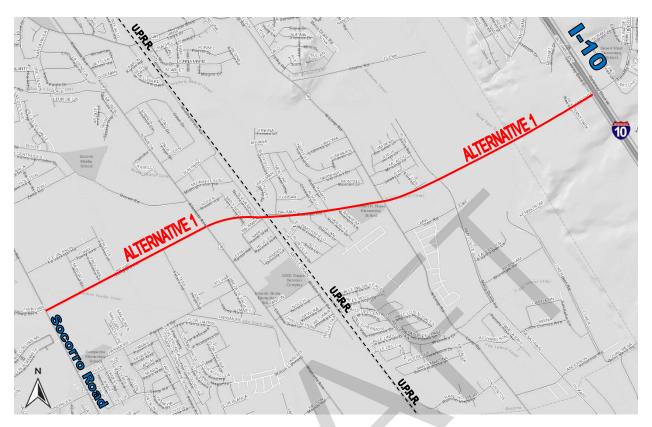


Figure 2: Recommended Technically Preferred Alternative

In May 2013, the El Paso District of TxDOT initiated a Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study to identify the transportation needs within the future Border Highway East (BHE) area (TxDOT 2013). Although the PEL study was not specific to the Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) project, it identified operational deficiencies and lack of connectivity to Interstate Highway 10 (I-10) within the City of Socorro. Based on the results of this study, the project team has developed three viable alternatives. The three alternatives would improve connectivity and access to the area by offering an alternative route parallel to State Loop 375 (LP 375) and FM 1281 (Horizon Boulevard). The study limits for the three alternatives were approximately from Interstate Highway 10 mile marker 39 to mile marker 41. Of the three alternatives, Alternative 1 is the Recommended Technically Preferred Alternative (Figure 2).

#### 2.2 Purpose and Need

The project is needed to improve mobility and east/west connectivity in the City of Socorro area. This would be achieved by constructing a new Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) corridor extending from Farmto-Market (FM) 258 (Socorro Road) to Interstate Highway 10 (I-10).

The proposed project would include four travel lanes (two in each direction) with a 16-foot raised median. Shared used paths and parkways are also proposed on each side of the roadway.

#### 2.3 Goals and Objectives

In addition to the development of the purpose and need statement, objectives for the proposed project were identified to be as follows:

- Include the No Build Alternative as a baseline comparison of the existing conditions and include this alternative throughout the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process.
- Develop viable build alternatives that would allow for a four-lane urban roadway while incorporating the findings of the PEL Study.
- Identify engineering considerations such as the 100-year floodplain, railroad, utilities, construction costs, irrigation canal right-of-way (ROW), and traffic data.
- Using the project's study area, create environmental constraints maps.
- Utilize the engineering and constraints data to compare alternatives.
- Meet with stakeholders and local officials to gather input on the alternatives.

#### 2.4 Typical Section

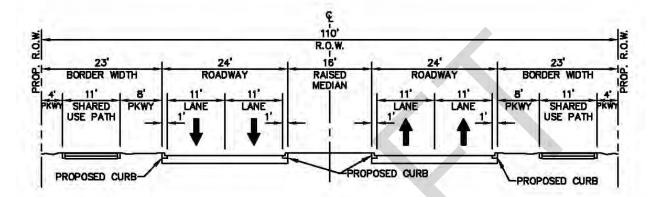


Figure 3: Proposed Typical Section

The proposed project would include four travel lanes (two in each direction) with a 16-foot raised median (**Figure 3**). Shared used paths and parkways are also proposed on each side of the roadway. Bicycle lanes would be designed in accordance with current TxDOT guidelines. In addition, the latest edition of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) Guide for the Development of Bicycle Facilities and Policy on Geometric Design of Highways and Streets will be utilized (AASHTO 2012 and 2018). A proposed typical section is shown below:

#### 2.5 Funding

The City of Socorro commissioned the Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI) to assess the TRZ and capture potential opportunities in the City of Socorro Area. On June 6, 2019, City of Socorro City Council met and approved the Arterial 1 Local Project Advance Funding Agreement (LPAFA) made by and between the State of Texas, acting by and through TXDOT and the City of Socorro.

#### 3.0 ALTERNATIVE ANALYSIS

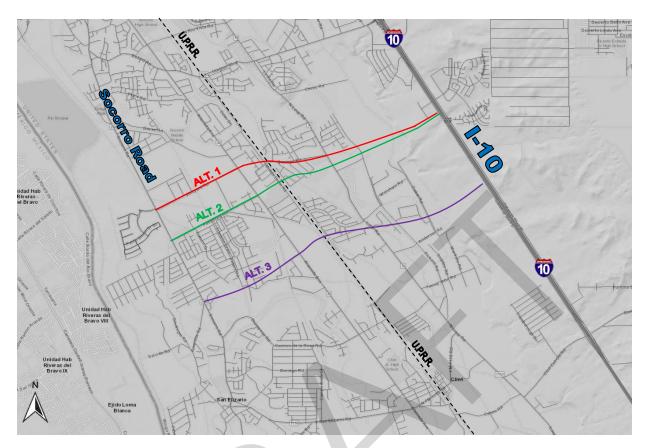


Figure 4: Proposed Viable Alternatives

The viable alternatives were created by meeting the purpose of and need for the project and by minimizing impacts to high-level engineering and environmental constraints such as the 100-year floodplain, railroad and irrigation canal ROW, utilities, and residential and commercial property owners. The three viable alternatives are shown in **Figure 4**.

The proposed typical roadway configuration for the corridor consists of four, 11-foot-wide travel lanes (two lanes in each direction) separated by a 16-foot median (**Figure 3**). In addition, a shared used path would be included and would be separated from traffic using an 8- foot parkway. The alternative alignments maximize existing roadways to the highest extent possible.

**Alternative 1** utilizes existing Vineyard Road for a portion of the alignment. It has the least amount of ROW Acquisition and least amount of arroyo/drainage ditch crossings. Alternative 1 ranks worst in public input and colonias potentially impacted.

**Alternative 2** utilizes the existing Passmore Road for a portion of the alignment. It has the lowest construction cost and ranks best in the highest driver usage. Alternative 3 ranks worst out of the three alternatives in general.

**Alternative 3** requires the highest amount of ROW acquisition as it does not utilize the ROW of an existing street. This translates to Alternative 3 has the highest construction cost. This alternative also ranks worst in the commercial parcels and agriculture land use impacts.

A railroad bridge overpass with extensive retaining walls is also currently proposed for all alternatives. The length of this bridge affects the estimated construction cost of each alternative. All proposed alternatives incorporate a 110-foot-wide proposed ROW with potential additional corner clips needed at intersections to accommodate right-turn lanes.

The following sections describe the evaluation process of the alternatives that led to the proposed preferred alternative.

#### 3.1 Engineering Constraints

Multiple engineering constraints were developed based on the purpose and need for the project, the project goals and objectives, and specific elements within the project study area. The sections below

provide a discussion of the engineering constraints and how they were qualified or quantified in the alternative evaluation matrix.

#### 3.1.1 Proposed Bridges

Due to the presence of irrigation canals and a railroad within the study area, several bridges are proposed for each alternative. Coordination with the El Paso County Water Improvement District No.1 (EPCWID#1) and Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) will be needed throughout the project design. The irrigation canals are all potentially contributing features to the EPCWID#1, which is protected under the National Register of Historic Places. These irrigation canals and features irrigate farmland in the area, therefore impacts to these irrigation canals and features shall be maintained at a minimum. A summary of the irrigation canals and features crossed by each alternative is shown in the table below:

In addition, all of the alternatives cross the Union Pacific Railroad; therefore, bridges over these features have been proposed for each of the three alternatives. It is important to note that as a result, the greater the number of bridges and longer the bridges are, the higher the cost of the alternative.

#### 3.1.2 Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 100-year Floodplain Impacts

Portions of the three alternatives are located within a FEMA "effective" 100-year floodplain. The effective 100-year floodplain is the currently approved FEMA floodplain. Alternative 1 and Alternative 2 each include 1 acre located within the FEMA "effective" 100-year floodplain. Alternative 3 includes 4-acres located within the FEMA "effective" 100-year floodplain.

#### 3.1.3 H&H

The proposed storm sewers for the Arterial 1 (1682 Boulevard) project will be designed in accordance with TxDOT's latest Hydraulic design Manual. In addition, a full hydrology and hydraulic study will be conducted in the next phase of the project to further evaluate and address existing and proposed drainage conditions.

#### 3.1.4 Property Owner Impacts

Estimated proposed ROW for Alternative 1 is approximately 44 acres, Alternative 2 is approximately 45 acres, and Alternative 3 is approximately 57 acres. Alternative A, requires the least amount of ROW acreage acquisition, impacts the least number of residential structures and the lowest number of commercial properties. The total number of impacted structures for Alternative 1 is 37, for Alternative 2 it was 77, and for Alternative 3 it was 24 structures.

#### 3.1.5 Utility Impacts

Impact on utilities was assessed in the matrix provided by DEC (formerly Dannenbaum Engineering Corp.) and ICF (formerly Blanton & Associates). Water and sewer lines belong to the Lower Valley Water District. A major gas line, owned by Texas Gas Service, has been identified along the Union Pacific Railroad. According to data obtained in the development of this matrix, Alternative 1 and Alternative 3 ranked best and alternative 2 ranked worst. Once the utility survey is completed, additional utilities may be identified. The utilities identified within the respective alternative options are as follows:

#### 3.1.6 Construction Cost

An Opinion of Probable Construction Cost (OPCC) for each alternative was prepared by DEC per previous contract with the City of Socorro (2018). Applying 2023 unit pricing resulted in an average increase of 11%. A comparison between DEC's 2018 OPCC and CEA's 2023 OPCC is shown in the table below:

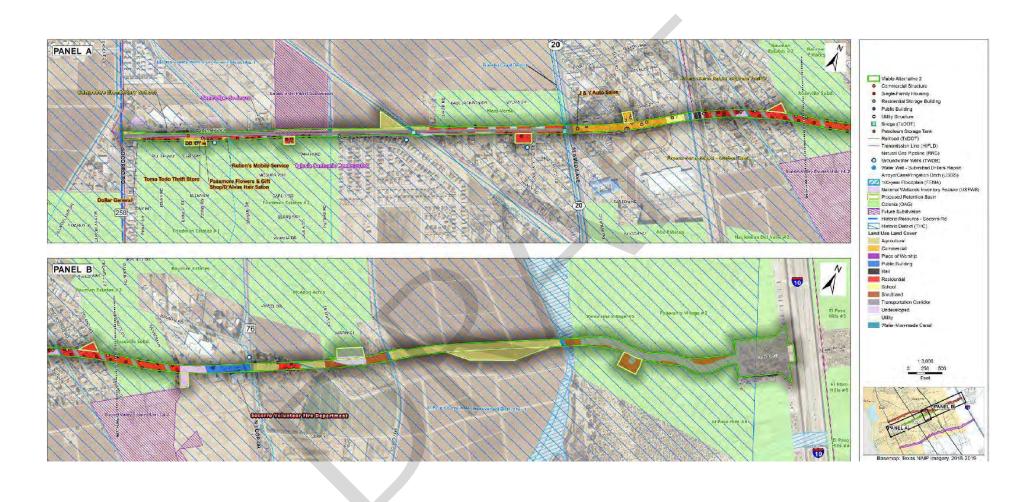
**Figure 5: Environmental Constraints**

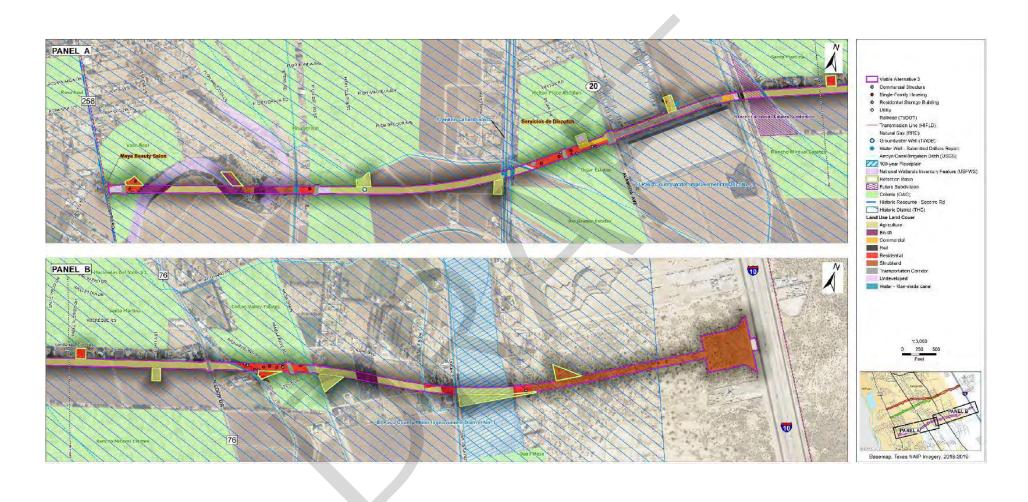
**Figure 6: Environmental Constraints**

#### 3.4 Alternative Evaluation

Once environmental and engineering constraints were identified, an alternative evaluation matrix was created that provided qualitative and quantitative values for each viable alternative's potential impacts to the identified constraints (**Table 5**). Note that Estimates Construction Cost included in this matrix was developed by DEC using best practices under previous contract.

The amount of data in this table was then reduced by removing constraints that were not differentiators (i.e., if certain constraints would be impacted similarly by each alternative, they were removed from the next round of constraints analysis). This new matrix was then revised to a ranking matrix in which "1" was the best and "3' was the worst (**Table 6**).

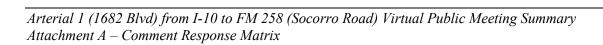

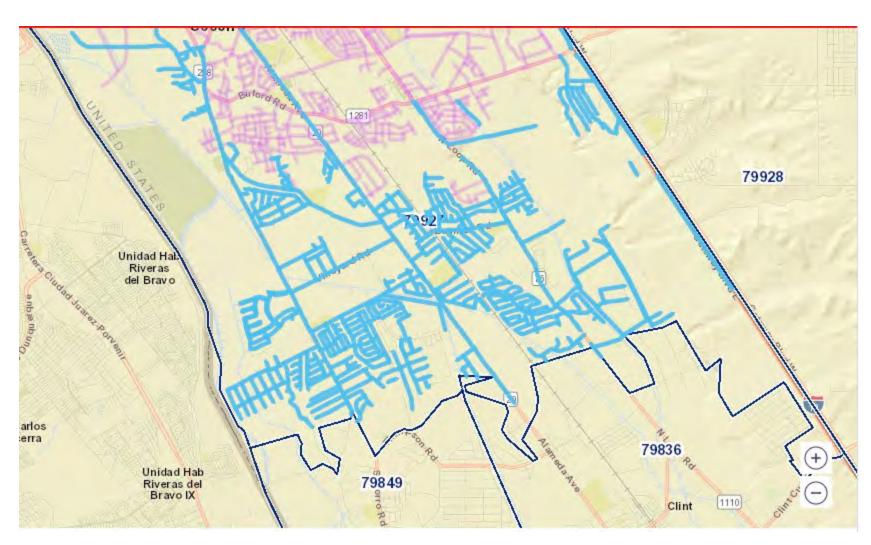

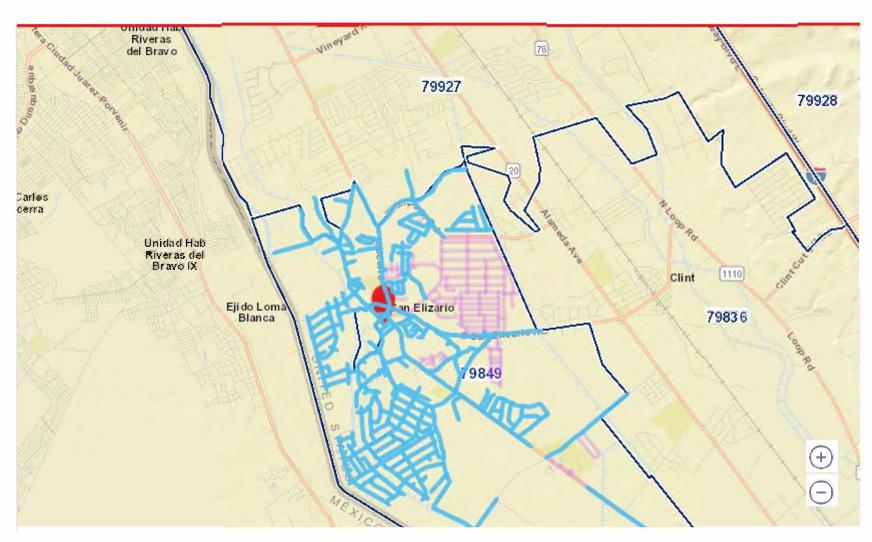

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don't let this happen," she remembered telling herself, worried that she might faint or hemorrhage and be forced to go to a hospital in Juárez. She couldn't count on doctor-patient confidentiality: Anyone who realized she'd had an abortion could report her to the police.

## What if I get caught?

While Lucero traveled north for her abortion, many El Pasoans turn south. In Juárez, they find cheap, easy access to misoprostol, an abortion-inducing medication that is sold over the counter as an ulcer treatment at many Mexican pharmacies — a welcome solution for those willing to have abortions outside a health care setting, as tightening legal restrictions make the procedures tougher to come by in Texas clinics.

In the Paso del Norte region, fronterizas on both sides of the Rio Grande have long looked across the border to end their pregnancies on terms they can't always choose at home.

Now, however, Juarenses must look elsewhere. The U.S. land border remains closed to most Mexican nationals, and in March 2020, El Paso lost all abortion services.

The consequences of El Paso's barren abortion landscape, along with the pandemic-era closure of the U.S. border, have rippled across the Rio Grande. In the 15 months that El Paso's Planned Parenthood offered abortion services, about 3% of its patients were from Mexico, according to the clinic. But the Texas city is no longer a legal haven for people like Lucero, who once came to El Paso to have abortions without fear of prosecution.

El Pasoans, meanwhile, could soon rely all the more on Juárez for abortion pills

On Sept. 1, a new Texas law will effectively ban state clinics from performing abortions roughly six weeks after conception — as soon as cardiac activity can be detected in an embryo, and before many know they are pregnant. With dwindling abortion access, more El Pasoans seeking abortions may choose to cross the border if the law, known as Senate Bill 8, takes effect.

# Texas law's restrictions on abortions

Over the last two decades, Texas state lawmakers have enacted increasingly strict regulations on abortion providers.

In 2013, after the passage of House Bill 2, which imposed hospital-like standards on abortion facilities, two El Paso clinics temporarily closed and procedures in the county dropped by 40%. Though the Supreme Court struck down the measure in 2016, other restrictions have remained in place. By 2017, about 96% of Texas counties had no abortion clinics.

El Paso was an exception until the pandemic. Then, in March 2020, the Planned Parenthood physicians who'd once flown to El Paso twice a month to perform abortions stopped coming due to COVID safety concerns. That month, El Paso's last remaining abortion provider — the Hill Top Women's Reproductive Clinic, where Lucero received her abortion — shuttered without explanation.

The Planned Parenthood clinic remains open in El Paso for other health services and is actively recruiting new physicians to resume abortion procedures. But Texas' ever-mounting series of restrictions has made physician recruitment all the more difficult, said Xochitl Rodriguez, philanthropy officer for Planned Parenthood of Greater Texas in El Paso. Rodriguez could not say when the clinic would resume offering abortions

In addition to banning clinical abortions after about six weeks, Senate Bill 8 would empower individuals to sue abortion providers and anyone else who "aids or abets" someone seeking the procedure past this timeframe. In July, dozens of abortion clinics and advocacy groups sued to block the measure before it starts. At a hearing scheduled for Monday, they hoped to convince a federal district judge in Austin to stop the law from taking effect. On Friday, however, the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals canceled that hearing.

"(W)ithout the courts stepping in, on Wednesday, Texans will be denied their constitutional right to abortion in violation of fifty years of precedent," Julie Murray, an attorney representing the Planned Parenthood Federation of America in the case, said in a written statement.

At the national level, the Supreme Court has agreed to hear a case where Mississippi's attorney general has asked to overturn Roe v. Wade and Planned Parenthood v. Casey, the landmark rulings establishing the constitutional right to end a pregnancy.

Abortion opponents hope the court's conservative majority will soon do just that, among them Texas Gov. Greg Ab-

bott. In July, he joined a coalition of anti-abortion governors to file an amicus brief urging justices to declare abortion unconstitutional. During the spring legislative session, Abbott signed into law a measure that would automatically ban the procedure if Roe v. Wade is struck down.

## El Paso-Juárez exchange

Walk across the Downtown Paso del Norte Bridge into Juárez, and "the first thing you see is bar, bar, pharmacy, bar — maybe a good restaurant here and there," said Lina-Maria Murillo, an assistant professor at the University of Iowa who researches the history of reproductive health care on the border. There, any number of pharmacies sell misoprostol, a medication that induces abortions, in 28-pill boxes that run as low as \$20.

"This tells us that for a very long time abortion has been a major part of the health economy of the borderlands," Murillo said. "(P)eople in border region go to Mexico to get dental work done, checkups — abortion is obviously one part of that health care regime."

Although it is illegal in Chihuahua to use misoprostol to terminate a pregnancy, the medication is sold over the counter at Mexican pharmacies to treat ulcers.

In Texas border communities, people have long managed their own abortions at higher rates than the rest of the state and country. A statewide survey of abortion clinics found that 12% of patients living along the Texas-Mexico border had at some point attempted to manage their own abortions — compared to 7% of patients throughout Texas. and 2.6% nationwide.

That practice has begun to take hold nationwide. Where abortions outside the clinical setting once conjured images of coat hangers and dangerous folk remedies, the practice has grown safer and more effective with the rising use of abortion pills.

To end pregnancies, U.S. clinics — and now, some telemedicine services — offer a two-drug regimen of mifepristone and misoprostol, which in combination is more effective than misoprostol alone. But with mifepristone hard to come by in Mexico and much of the global south, many rely solely on misoprostol, which is about 85% effective compared to roughly 93% for the two-drug regimen. The World Health Organization has endorsed misoprostol as a safe and effective way to self-manage abortions up to 10 weeks after conception.

As barriers to clinical abortions mount, people are more likely to self-manage their abortions. Abigail Aiken, an associate professor at the University of Texas at Austin, found with her research team that the number of self-managed abortions rises along with each 40-mile increase in distance to the nearest abortion clinic. According to the study, the lower someone's income, the more likely they are to attempt to end their pregnancy outside a health care setting.

Self-managed abortions increased dramatically during the pandemic, when the U.S. Food and Drug Administration authorized providers to send mifepristone and misoprostol to patients by mail. Nineteen states, including Texas, do not allow in-state providers to mail these medications, but they have little control over organizations that operate outside of the state, or even the country

Aiken also found that requests to the international group Aid Access, which provides abortion medication and telemedicine consultation, spiked during the pandemic, especially in Texas. When Gov. Abbott imposed a four-week ban on abortion for much of April 2020, citing COVID safety concerns, the study found that Texans' requests for Aid Access abortion support rose by nearly 94% from the previous year, the highest increase in the country.

# Criminalization and abortion law exceptions in Chihuahua

Even after her abortion, Lucero still feared that her family might find out. The fronteriza felt she hadn't just crossed a geographical line to get an abortion; she'd crossed a moral one as well.

"I knew I was doing something illegal in Mexico and there were a thousand reasons for which I could go to jail," Lucero said in Spanish.

Since 2013, 10 Juarenses have been charged with illegally terminating a pregnancy, according to data from the Chihuahua State Prosecutor's Office. Only one, in 2018, resulted in a conviction and a prison sentence of 32 months.

According to information published by the Executive Secretary of the National Security System, nine reports of alleged crimes involving abortion took place in Chihuahua for 2020 and three for 2021, with the latest update released in June.

According to information obtained from the High Court of Justice of the state of Chihuahua through the country's online National Transparency Platform, there were no registered cases with a pronounced sentence in Chihuahua involving the illegal termination of a pregnancy in 2020 and none so far in 2021

Though most abortions in Chihuahua are criminalized, the law does grant some exceptions. The criminal code of the state of Chihuahua states that terminating a pregnancy is legal in cases of sexual violence, if the woman's health is at risk, if the woman has been forcibly inseminated or if the abortion was accidental

Official The Mexican Norm, NOM-046-SSA2-2005, is the legal framework that lays out the criteria to address and prevent family and sexual violence against women, and the standards for abortion services in the state in cases of rape. Those services include access to syphilis and HIV testing, counseling, pregnancy tests and, in the case of a positive result, emergency contraception pills or the necessary procedures to terminate a pregnancy, if requested.

Medical staff are not required to verify the statements of those who petition for a voluntary abortion in the case of sexual assault. They must take petitioners at their word and act "under the principle of good faith referenced in Article 5 of the Victim's General Law."

Though the law also allows medical staff to decline to offer abortion services based on a conscientious objection, the state is still required to provide a physician willing to perform the procedure.

Chihuahua's state health services fully comply with the standards set forth by the NOM-046, according to Mitzi Alicia Garcia, the Chihuahua Health Department's coordinator of Reproductive Health in Ciudad Juárez. Garcia affirmed that in cases where abortion is legal under the state's penal code, all state hospitals can guarantee medical attention from a non-objecting physician.

But Elia Orrantia, the director of the center against family violence SinViolencia, said in her experience, helping women get a legal abortion is still a challenge, as many physicians can still refuse to perform the procedure.

"In Chihuahua, conscientious objection is still very prevalent," Orrantia explained in Spanish. "It's really the doctor who decides if there's going to be a legal termination of the pregnancy."

Not all state-run hospitals in Ciudad Juárez have the services required to prevent or terminate a pregnancy, Orrantia added. Sometimes people seeking an abortion will have to be referred to other hospitals.

"Best-case scenario, the victim is transferred to another state hospital, but they have to tell their story once again to receive a service that should be guaranteed by the state," she said.

Even when abortion is legal under state law, Juarenses may shrink from requesting the procedure to avoid judgment and stigma, she noted.

Between restrictions to access and the looming fear of criminalization, some Juarenses may still choose to manage their own abortions after considering that the medication is fairly accessible at pharmacies.

This was the case in 2019, when an acquaintance reached out to Lucero. She asked for her help knowing that she had been very vocal on social media about her position in favor of the legalization of abortion in Mexico. Most importantly, Lucero wouldn't judge her.

After taking misoprostol, she endured an infection for more than a week. Not only that, the medication failed to terminate her pregnancy.

Lucero had taken the day off from work to help her. She took the woman to her own gynecologist — the same doctor who had discreetly handed Lucero a card with contact information for the Hill Top Women's Reproductive Clinic back in 2017. The doctor recommended a procedure to remove the infected tissue.

Unlike Lucero, the woman didn't have a visa to easily cross to El Paso. Even if she did, she had no money and no support from her family.

"With her, I saw the counterpart. Those were the two faces of this experience: what I had lived and what she was currently living," Lucero said.

The two cried in the car on their way to the hospital and practiced what to say to the medical staff once they got there.

Lucero told her there was no way for medical staff to know that she had taken misoprostol. "Deny it completely," she said. "Tell them that you felt this intense pain and started bleeding this morning and that's why you're in urgent care."

Lucero waited outside of the state Hospital de la Mujer in Ciudad Juárez, while a woman she barely knew had just walked in to get checked. She could only stay outside the hospital with dozens of people who were waiting for their loved ones.

A sheet of paper would be posted on the glass door of the hospital with updates, but every time she checked, there was no news about the girl, who until then was only an acquaintance.

A city police car pulled into the hospital's entrance. The vehicle parked over the curb, its lights flashing. Lucero's heart dropped to her feet thinking about the woman inside the hospital.

The woman had no access to her phone; Lucero couldn't warn her that she may have been reported. She didn't know what to do, but was convinced that she couldn't take off and leave her now friend behind.

"I was imagining myself in prison already," Lucero said. "I thought about how someone had told me that accomplices also go to jail for helping those who want to get abortions."

Under Article 143 of Chihuahua's criminal code, anyone who forces or assists a woman obtain an abortion "will be punished with six months to three years of prison, with whichever medium used, as long as this was done with the women's consent." Without the woman's consent, the penalty will go up to three to six years.

Another police vehicle parked by the entrance, and that's when Lucero saw a pregnant inmate from the federal penal center get off the truck. She wore the center's uniform and shackles on her ankles and wrists.

Lucero felt relieved but was still filled with anger.

"Why do we have to go through this? Not only do we not want to be pregnant but we also have to deal with this legal matter and economic struggles just because some people in government get to decide. They get to say 'No. You don't get a say over your body."

After more than six hours, her friend came out. She'd gotten the care she needed, and no one on the medical staff asked a thing about it.

# A privilege or a right?

Lucero's abortion put a financial burden on her. But unlike her friend, she was able to pay for the procedure. And ultimately, having a car and tourist visa allowed her to get an abortion without legal or health complications.

"I recognize that I was able to do that with all of (my) privileges," Lucero said,

ara Moira Smith y su madre, julio prometía un destello de normalidad tras meses de aislamiento. Ambas volaron de Alaska a Houston y visitaron a familiares para celebrar el primer cumpleaños de la nieta de su primo. La madre de Smith compró un pañalero con un estampado rosa como regalo y todos tomaron fotografías de la cara del bebé embarrada de chocolate.

Smith, de 46 años, sabía que la familia de su primo no estaba vacunada, pero trataron de no preocuparse demasiado por eso. Ella y su madre

habían recibido el esquema completo de la vacuna Pfizer desde hace meses. Una tarde en la habitación del hotel, la madre de Smith hizo un comentario espontáneo a sus parientes: "Pueden quitarse los cubrebocas, pero tienen que prometer que se van a vacunar", les reprochó. La mañana siguiente, Smith y su madre se dirigían a casa, estaban en una escala en el aeropuerto de Seattle, ca: el bebé de su familiar tenía fiebre y dio positivo por Covid-19.

Dos días después, Smith despertó sintiéndose como si hubiera sido "atropellada por un camión Mack", tenía dolores corporales y la garganta irritada; dio positivo por coronavirus. La semana siguiente, su madre, que tiene 76 años y padece cáncer de pulmón, le envió

de pulmón, le envió por mensaje de texto un emoji de un termómetro para indicarle que ella también tenía fiebre y posteriormente tuvo que ir a la sala de urgencias por Covid. Smith y su madre son parte de una ola de estadounidenses que se están contagiando de Cpvod aunque poseen el esquema completo de vacunación, estas son conocidas como infecciones posvacunación.

Expertos en salud pública con-

tinúan creyendo que las infecciones posvacunación son relativamente poco comunes y en escasas ocasiones derivan en enfermedades graves u hospitalizaciones. Las vacunas disponibles en Estados Unidos ofrecen una protección poderosa contra

la enfermedad grave, la hospitalización y la muerte por Covid. Un análisis reciente de datos reportados por los estados de la Fundación de la Familia Kaiser encontró que más de nueve de cada diez casos de Covid-

19 que acabaron en hospitalización y muerte ocurrieron entre personas que no contaban con el esquema completo de vacunación.

"Siempre anticipamos que habría algunas infecciones posvacunación porque las vacunas tenían un máximo de efectividad del 95 por ciento", dijo William Schaffner, catedrático de Enfermedades Infecciosas en la Universidad Vanderbilt. "Las vacunas se diseñaron para prevenir la enfermedad grave y son espectacularmente exitosas en ello".

No obstante, a medida que la variante delta más transmisible se vuelve la dominante en Estados Unidos, se reportan números en aumento de casos de infección posvacunación, aunque la mayoría son leves.

"La delta es mucho más contagiosa, así que conforme se propaga entre los no vacunados hay un derrame hacia la población vacunada", explicó Schaffner: "Los no vacunados son una gran autopista de transmisión. Los vacunados son una pequeña bocacalle"

Debido a que las personas infectadas con la variante delta tienen una presencia mucho mayor del virus en la nariz y el tracto respiratorio superi-or, la importancia de portar un cubrebocas se ha vuelto extrema. Despué de que los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades (CDC) modificaron su lineamiento sobre los cubrebocas, al recomendar que las personas vacunadas en áreas de alto contagio vuelvan a usar mascarillas en espacios públicos cerrados, millones de estadounidenses que cuentan con el esquema de vacunación completo tuvieron que ajustar sus expectativas para los meses del otoño que parecían ofrecer algo semejante a la festividad. Además, las rutinas de un pequeño subconjunto de estadounidenses va se han visto trastocadas por las infecciones posvacunación. Estimulados por inquietudes

sobre las infecciones posvacunación, los funcionarios federales de salud recomendaron hace poco que los estadounidenses que fueron immunizados con las vacunas Pfizer o Moderna reciban una tercera dosis en los próximos meses. Esta semana, Johnson & Johnson reportó que una inyección de refuerzo de su vacuna elevaba los niveles de anticuerpos contra el coronavirus.

Para algunos, la infección posvacunación se ha sentido como una alergia leve y han tenido síntomas que incluyen tos, escurrimiento nasal y garganta irritada. Otros han presentado casos más graves, por los que han estado en cama con dolores corporales, fiebre y escalofríos. Otros más han tenido algunas de las señales que delatan el contagio de Covid, como la pérdida del gusto y el olfato, erupción cutánea y niebla mental.

"Lo llamábamos el síndrome de la cabeza flotante", dijo Molly O'Brien-Foelsch, de 47 años, ejecutiva de mercadotecnia en Pensilvania quien dio positivo por Covid después de un viaje a las Islas Vírgenes Británicas con su esposo el mes pasado. "Se sintió como si tuviera un malvavisco enorme en la cabeza".

Los científicos creen que las infecciones posvacunación en raras ocasiones derivan en enfermedades graves, pero ha habido casos de hosnitificaciones productoradas

pitalizaciones prolongadas.
Al padre de Elaina Cary-Fehr,
Isaac, de 64 años, conductora de Uber
en Austin, Texas, lo transfirieron a un
centro de cuidados prolongados tras
ser hospitalizado con neumonía por
Covid en junio y después de recibir
una cánula de traqueotomía. Fue
dado de alta del centro esta semana.

"Creo en la vacuna, mantuve la esperanza de que funcionaría y lo hizo, pero odio que esto le haya tenido que pasar a mi familia", dijo Cary-Fehr. Conforme muchos estadounidenses comienzan el familiar ejercicio de cuestionar y cancelar los planes, los científicos hacen hincapié en la importancia continua de usar cubrebocas para reducir la propagación y las infecciones.

"Si te contagias y exhalas el virus, se quedará atrapado en tu mascarilla", dijo John Moore, profesor de Microbiología e Inmunología en Weill Cornell. "Estos virus no tienen tijeras que puedan cortar a través del cubrebocas".

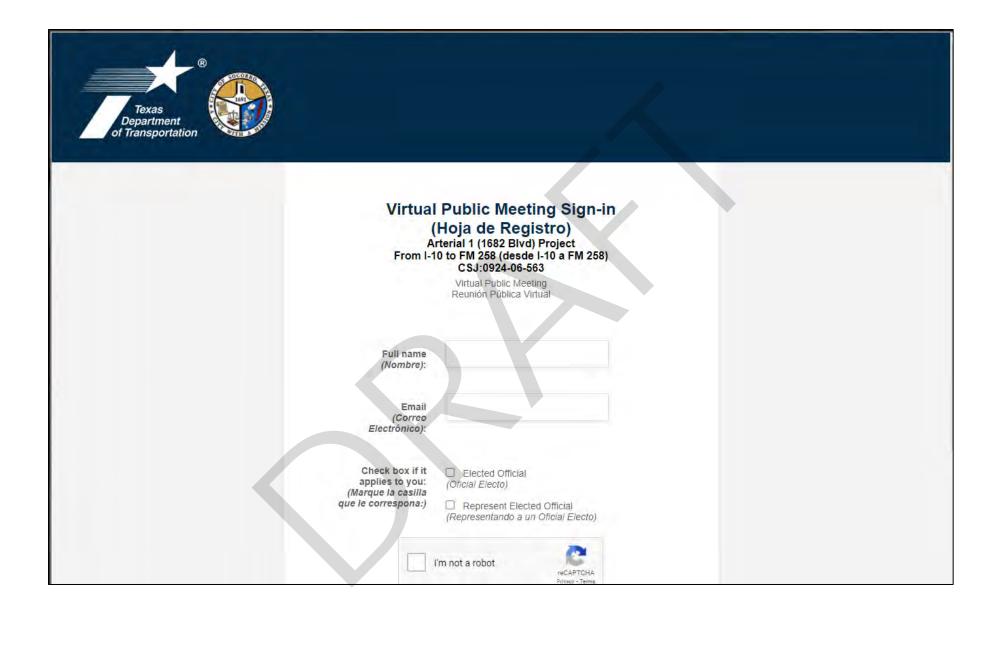

I have been recently made aware of the proposed Project Arterial 1 (1682 BLVD). It gives me great pleasure to know that my City is working hard on making our Town more beautiful and helping us have a better living. I understand that our City is growing and with it our needs change as well. However, my family and I, as well as all of my neighbors, are extremely sadden by the proposed routes. Many of us will be dislodged from our homes, which have been with us for many generations. Below I will review the proposed routes and reasons to select or not select them.

In the Viable Alternative 1, I can see that the road will be starting of in El Paso County and extend thru many homes. This route will impact a Robert R. Rojas School and many homes of which have had a single owner or have been passed down. Rojas and the surrounding neighbors will experience a lot more traffic if a Main Road is created. I could compare it to the traffic that forms in Rio Vista with Idea Public School and Socorro High School both in the morning and afternoon. As previously mentioned, many of these owners are elderly and will have extreme difficulty in finding a new home. Especially with the current Home Market Value. Homes and even empty lots are extremely expensive at the moment. Taking into consideration the proximity of Horizon Blvd to the proposed route, a Main Road so close would be unnecessary.

Viable Alternative 2, would have a starting point like Alternative 1 and would also extend thru many homes and City Buildings. This route will impact our Socorro Fire Department and Ernesto Serna. The Socorro Fire Department will have the Main Road go thru their parking lot. Looking at the El Paso Fire Station on 9418 North Loop, I think that our Socorro Fire Department, will be able to function properly just like it. Looking at Alternative 2, Serna will have the Main Road close to their track, which will not affect it as much as Rojas. Also, Serna has Alameda Ave that helps alleviate traffic. Like Alternative 1, this route will affect many of our Citizens as well and is too close to Horizon Blvd.

Lastly, Viable Alternative 3 will start further down on I10. Looking at the provided map, this route does not go thru any of our much needed schools nor any City Buildings. Taking into consideration the position of the starting point, this route will give enough separation from the proposed route and Horizon Blvd. This route will be in between Horizon Blvd and San Eli/Clint Exit. Comparing this route to the previous Alternative 1 and 2, this route will affect the least amount of homes.

If you would take into consideration my review, I would have to select Alternative 3 as the best option for a new Main Road. This route will still give us a direct connection between I10 and Socorro Rd and affect the least amount of families and buildings. From my perspective though, I would much rather choose not to build a new Main Road. The funds that would be used for the project, would be more beneficial to use within our existing roads. We can add sidewalks, lighting, landscaping to our neighborhoods. In my specific area, I can see that the intersecting streets in my home have been getting new pavement. Some neighbors actually got their entrance paved by the city. I have lived in my home all my life. So far, we've only gotten a street lamp installed. On behalf of the Paso del Norte Health Foundation, Paso del Norte Community Foundation, and Paso del Norte Trail Foundation, I am pleased to submit these comments in response to your call for public input on the proposed roadway improvements/alternatives for El Paso's Mission Valley.

Specifically, the Arterial 1 (1682 Blvd) project provides an opportunity to introduce a high-quality multimodal connection between I-10 and Socorro Road.

We believe that Alternative 1 will provide the greatest multimodal interconnectivity with the Paso del Norte Trail, including:

- The Paso del Norte Trail main alignment along the Franklin Canal/SH-20
- The Tigua Spur along the Franklin Feeder Canal
- Socorro-San Elizario Connector

We further believe that a high-speed, high-volume arterial is not an appropriate facility for on-street bike lanes, particularly for a facility that is being newly constructed. I have attached an alternative cross-section that provides a safer, more comfortable environment for pedestrians and cyclists of all ages and abilities using the same ROW as the proposed cross-section for your consideration- expanding the proposed sidewalk to a shared use path in order to physically separate cyclists from automobiles. The ROW allocated for the bike lane buffer can be used to increase the outer parkways, allowing space for appropriately sized shade trees to be installed on both sides of the path to provide a continuous shade canopy and encourage more pedestrian and cyclist activity.

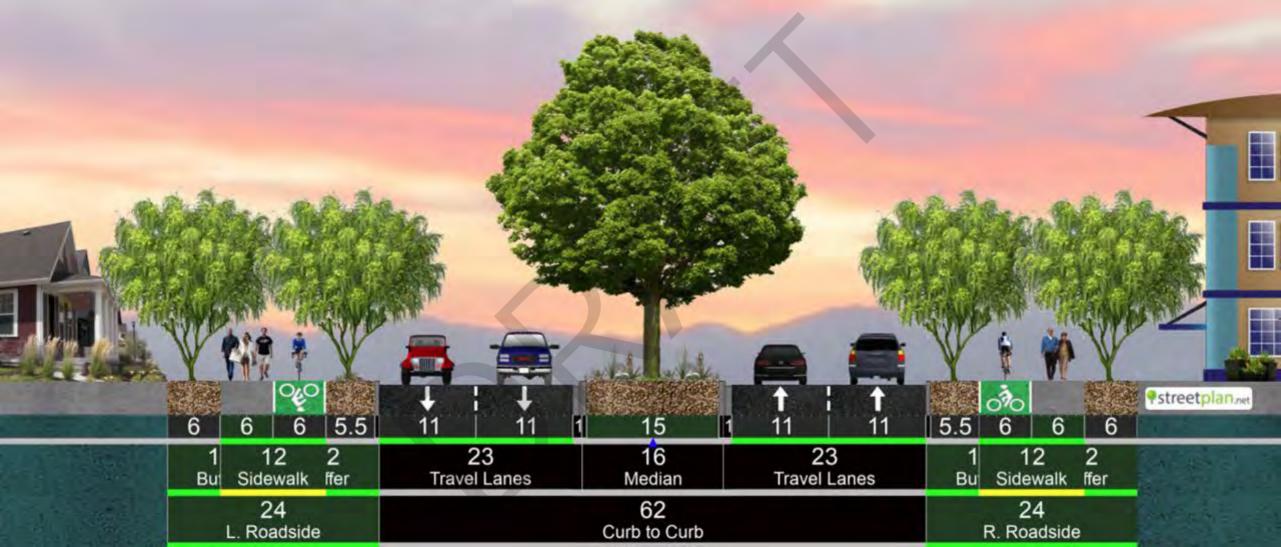

Alternative 1 is a route that that goes through the lead amount of population and does not end on Socorro Road in a densely populated area like San Elizario. It would not be beneficial for a bike path, walking paths and landscaping since it goes through the least populated area. It would be difficult to know where the divides in the road and turn lanes need to be created in the road since this area is not developed. This route would provide the least amount of help on congestion on Socorro Rd. and Texas 20.

Alternative 2 is already a major route from Socorro Road to Texas 20. Expansion of this road would be very beneficial to the current traffic pattern. This route would also be beneficial for 2 schools that will be next to the road or very close proximity to this route. 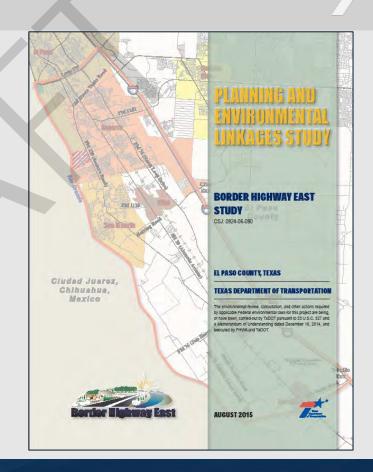

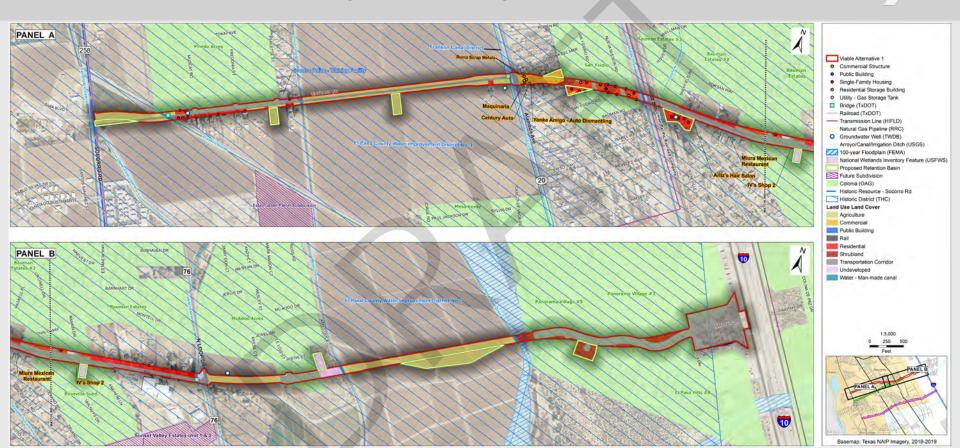

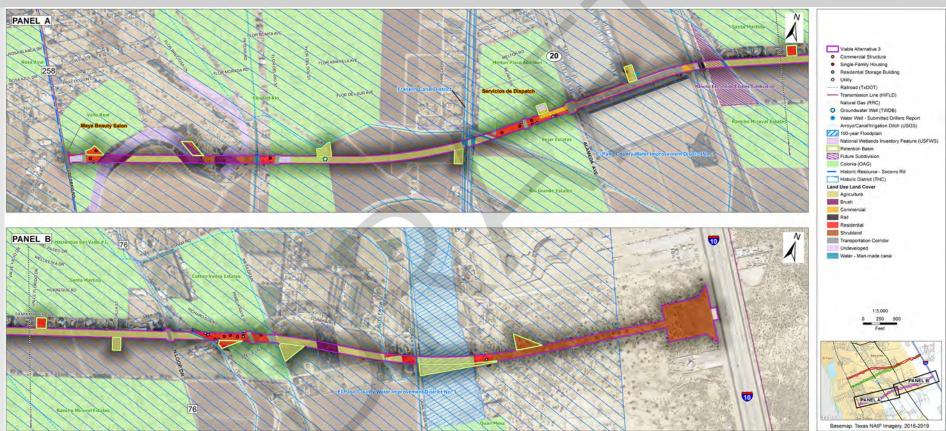

Three series of public meetings were held between 2013 and 2014 to present the PEL alternatives to the public. The Arterial 1 PEL conceptual alternative was carried forward to the currently proposed project and helped determine the study area.

The first board on the left provides the purpose and need for the project. The project is needed to accommodate increased traffic volumes due to increasing populations and development, and to address

congestion and a lack of connectivity in the region. The purpose of the project is to provide improved mobility and connectivity in the region by providing an east/west connection.

The second board from the left provides the project timeline. Please note this schedule is subject to change. We are currently at the first public meeting for the project. Public input received will help shape the project design and assist in selecting a technically preferred alternative. As the project design progresses, environmental analyses will be conducted. A public hearing or opportunity for a public hearing is anticipated to be held in 2023 to present the final project design and environmental findings. The approval date for the final schematic and environmental document is dependent on project funding as funding for the proposed project has not yet been identified.

The third board from the left provides the proposed typical section. Please note this design is subject to change. The proposed Arterial 1 roadway would consist of two 11-foot-wide travel lanes in each direction with a 16-foot-wide median. Approximate 5-foot-wide bike lanes, 6-foot-wide parkways, and 6-foot-wide sidewalks would also be constructed along both sides of the roadway. The travel lanes and the bike lanes would be separated by a 3-foot buffer. The right-of-way width would be approximately 110 feet.

Please advance to Station 4 when you are finished viewing this exhibit.

#### **STATION 4: ALTERNATIVE ANALYSIS**

Welcome to Station 4, which provides the viable alternatives and a summary of the alternative analyses to date. A high-level analysis of five conceptual alternatives resulted in the selection of the three viable alternatives shown. The conceptual alternatives included the alternative recommended by TxDOT's PEL Study mentioned in Station 2.

There are three boards in this station. The first board on the left shows the three proposed viable alternatives in more detail. Please click on each board for a separate narration describing what is shown.

This board provides the viable alternatives.

To see each alternative in greater detail, click on the "click here" icon next to each alternative and each environmental constraint map will open and show more detail. We would like your input. After viewing the alternatives, please let us know if you have a preferred alternative and why, by clicking on the comment button at the bottom right.

You can zoom in and out by using the "+" or "-" signs at the bottom of the screen, or by pinching the screen in or out if you have a touch screen for a closer view of each alternative. You can also move to different areas of the map by clicking and dragging your mouse left or right. The legend is on the right side of the map and it identifies the shading and symbols used on the map. Again, if you have comments on any of the alternatives, you can use the comment link below. In addition, it is important to note that the No Build Alternative has been carried forward for analysis of the existing condition. To continue to the next board, please click the "x" at the top right corner of this window.

This board provides a list of the engineering and environmental constraints that have been considered at each level of the alternative analysis. This list was used to analyze conceptual alternatives to narrow down the alternatives to the three viable alternatives shown in the first board. Note that "Parcel impacts" refers to the number of individual commercial or residential parcels impacted and "ROW impacts" refers to the

total acreage of impacts to all of the parcels. Also, "structure impacts" are counted if a building appears to be impacted by the proposed ROW line.

This board provides the viable alternative evaluation matrix. The information in this matrix is based on the engineering and environmental constraints listed on the second board in this station. These constraints were calculated quantitatively and qualitatively using engineering data and the constraints maps, and then ranked according to the level of impact. Please note that additional constraints were measured but were left out of the matrix if there was no difference between the impacts shown under each viable alternative.

After you have had a chance to review the alternative analysis station, please move to the final station.

### **STATION 5: COMMENT STATION**

This is the final station of the virtual public meeting. The board on the left provides contact information for the Socorro City Manager, the City's consultant Project Engineer, and the TxDOT Project Manager. La alternativa conceptual del PEL Arterial 1 se trasladó al proyecto actualmente propuesto y ayudó a determinar el área de estudio.

#### **ESTACION 3: RESUMEN DEL PROYECTO**

La estación 3 ofrece una visión general del proyecto, incluyendo el propósito y la necesidad del mismo, el calendario del proyecto y la sección típica propuesta.

El primer panel de la izquierda presenta el objetivo y la necesidad del proyecto. El proyecto es necesario para dar cabida a un mayor volumen de tráfico debido al aumento de la población y el desarrollo, y para resolver la congestión y la falta de conectividad este/oeste en la región. ### **SUMMARY**

This agreement provide transit services to the City of Socorro.

**Termination.** This Agreement terminates on September 30, 2023, unless before September 30, 2023

Changes to Service for Fiscal Year 2023. All changes, modifications, and deviations from the Service for Fiscal Year 2023 must be approved by EPATS. Each Member Entity will be responsible for increase to its local contribution amount that arise from its request for a service change. Any such increase will be reflected via a written amendment, executed by both Parties.

**Contribution Amount.** Within ten (10) business days of this Agreement's effective date, each Member Entity shall contribute and pay the full amount of its local contribution set forth in Exhibit B to this Agreement. EPATS and the Member Entities agree that the contribution amounts for Fiscal Year 2023 are as follows:

# INTERLOCAL PUBLIC SERVICE TRANSIT AND CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between the EL PASO AREA TRANSPORTATION SERVICES, LGC ("EPATS") and its member entities the TOWN OF HORIZON CITY ("HORIZON"), VILLAGE OF VINTON ("VINTON"), CITY OF SAN ELIZARIO ("SAN ELIZARIO"), and CITY OF SOCORRO ("SOCORRO"), acting by and through their duly authorized officials.

### RECITALS

WHEREAS, EPATS is a local government corporation and political subdivision organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas for the purpose of encouraging and assisting local units of government to join and cooperate with one another to provide and deliver regional multimodal transportation solutions for the residents of the Greater El Paso community; and

WHEREAS, HORIZON, VINTON, SAN ELIZARIO, and SOCORRO (collectively, the "Member Entities") are all local units of government and political subdivisions of the State of Texas who have joined and are members of EPATS and have representation on the EPATS Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, the Member Entities are committed to working together and to making the necessary financial contributions to EPATS to improve the transit services in El Paso County and in the areas that fall within their jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Member Entities are aware of the relevant transportation studies conducted by the Texas A&M Transportation Institute ("TTI") and Task Order 10 Best Practices and Guidelines for EPC Rural Public Transportation to Identify Potential Stop Locations and Route Configurations and the Member Entities agree that for Fiscal Year 2023 the transit services provided by EPATS will be pursuant to those studies and Task Order 10; and

WHEREAS, the Member Entities recognize that for Fiscal Year 2023 EPATS has contracted for services and incurred expenses and liabilities and that it is critical that each Member Entity pay its contribution amount as established in Exhibit B to this Agreement, which is attached and made a part of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to and under the authority of the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, as amended, EPATS and the Member Entities desire to enter into an intergovernmental agreement to perform governmental functions and services; and

WHEREAS, the Member Entities agree to pay the cost of the Service, including all costs associated with the Service, as described below in this Agreement; and

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the covenants, conditions, and provisions set forth herein, EPATS and the Member Entities agree as follows:

#### **AGREEMENT**

- 1. Effective Date and Agreement Period. This Agreement becomes effective when signed by the last party whose signing makes the agreement fully executed. This Agreement shall remain in effect until September 30, 2023.
- **2. Termination.** This Agreement terminates on September 30, 2023, unless before September 30, 2023:
  - **a.** The Agreement is terminated in writing with the consent of EPATS and the Member Entity seeking termination of the Agreement; or
  - **b.** EPATS in its discretion terminates the Agreement by providing the Member Entities with thirty (30) days written notice.
  - **c.** By any party upon the failure of any other party to fulfill the obligations set forth in this Agreement. Any party terminating the Agreement must provide EPATS with thirty (30) days written notice.
- 3. Service for Fiscal Year 2023. The Service for Fiscal Year 2023 is based on a TTI study and shall be according to Exhibit A, which is attached to and made a part of this Agreement. All Parties agree to the Service for Fiscal Year 2023. The Member Entities agree that in order to provide maximum flexibility in the provision of transit services, including to facilitate the day-to-day operations of the transit services, EPATS is allowed to make any and all reasonable changes to the Service provided, however, that EPATS must notify the Member Entities of any material changes as soon as possible, but no later than thirty (30) days after a material change to the Service.

The Service provided under this Agreement shall be available to any passenger traveling in El Paso County, subject to any rules implemented by First Transit, Inc., the transit provider for the transit services included in this Agreement. Passengers boarding this Service will be required to pay the valid fare for the Service.

Going forward, EPATS shall approve a service plan, including any service changes, and budget for each fiscal year. Adjustments to routes alignment, service area, fare, new infrastructure and related items are provided by TTI's details reports and studies with the ultimate goal to improve the transit service. During implementation, these items are subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances such as Right-of-Way constrains, timings conflicts, funding or related items that may affect the initial proposed changes.

- **4. Changes to Service for Fiscal Year 2023.** All changes, modifications, and deviations from the Service for Fiscal Year 2023 must be approved by EPATS. Each Member Entity will be responsible for increase to its local contribution amount that arise from its request for a service change. Any such increase will be reflected via a written amendment, executed by both Parties.
- **5. Service for Fiscal Year 2024.** EPATS must approve the Service for Fiscal Year 2024 before the 2024 fiscal year. Subject to the review and approval of party, EPATS and the Member Entities intend to execute a separate agreement for the Service for Fiscal Year 2024.
- **6.** Contribution Amount. Within ten (10) business days of this Agreement's effective date, each Member Entity shall contribute and pay the full amount of its local contribution set forth in Exhibit B to this Agreement. EPATS and the Member Entities agree that the contribution amounts for Fiscal Year 2023 are as follows:

The Service for Fiscal Year 2023 shall be provided in consideration of the local contributions paid by the Member Entities and provided the local contribution amounts are paid in accordance with this Agreement.

The amount of the local contribution is subject to change in the event that a Member Entity requests a change, modification, or adjustment to the Service for Fiscal Year 2023.

- 7. Use of Contribution Amount. The Member Entities agree that EPATS can use all funds received under this Agreement for any and all lawful purposes necessary to carry out the duties and functions of EPATS.
- **8. Refund of Contribution Amount.** If EPATS or a Member Entity terminates this Agreement, the Member Entity may request a refund of the remaining balance of its contribution amount not yet been used, spent, promised, or allocated towards the Service for Fiscal Year 2023.
- **9.** Suspension of Services. In the event that a Member Entity fails to pay its local contribution amount, EPATS may immediately suspend all services provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- 10. Notices and Payments. All notices and payments required by this Agreement, including payment of the local contribution must amount shall be sent to EPATS electronically to an account it has identified or by mail to the following address:

11. Emergency Changes to Service. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, Parties acknowledge that the County of El Paso has the right to take immediate action to initiate a change, if necessary, without prior EPATS approval if the service change is needed to address a safety issue or any significant public concern. The County will provide notice to EPATS of any such change at the next EPATS Board meeting, or as soon as possible. The change in service will be included in a subsequent service plan and budget for EPATS adoption.

Required detours or other short-term changes do not require any notification to or action of EPATS.

- 12. Public Meetings. Each Member Entity agrees to participate in public meetings pertaining to the Service, assist with the coordination of such events including coordination with the marketing efforts for EPATS, and facility locations where public meetings can be hosted with easy access to the community. Each Member Entity shall be responsible for advertising and announcing public meetings on any of its social platforms.
- 13. EPATS Duties and Responsibilities. EPATS shall create and implement necessary policies for the Service, public engagement, marketing plans, and the functioning and operation of EPATS, which may be revised from time to time ("EPATS Board Policies").
- **14. El Paso County Duties and Responsibilities**. El Paso County shall clean and maintain the bus stop and related amenities consistent with the schedule for other bus stops. Maintenance shall include, by example and not limitation, cleaning and removal of any trash, graffiti, debris, snow, ice, or other hazards and obstacles.

The County shall install and maintain bus stop poles and signs at bus stops for the Service. The graphics used for the signs and the locations of the poles and signs shall be approved by El Paso County prior to installation. Any repairs to the bus stops will meet the same specifications as provided by El Paso County construction specifications.

County of El Paso, at its own expense, shall construct and maintain (or cause to be constructed and maintained) all necessary facilities at the bus stop(s), including by example and not limitation, any necessary sidewalks, pavement, lighting, or bus shelters. Maintenance shall include cleaning of any trash, debris, snow, ice, or other hazards or obstacles at bus stops. However, each Member Entity shall be responsible for the infrastructure required to close any gaps for pedestrian connectivity to the bus shelter facility.

**15. Member Entities Duties and Responsibilities.** Each Member Entity shall permit EPATS to operate the Service on its streets and at approved bus stops. Each Member entity shall

provide all maintenance of the streets as necessary and shall be responsible for wear and tear of pavement surfaces.

Each Member Entity shall provide the County of El Paso with guidance and will help expedite the obtaining all permits, licenses, inspections, and permissions required for the Service in in their jurisdiction. (Any future construction, improvements, service expansion, etc., entity permits, traffic control, and related documents

shall assist in marketing and communications regarding the Service to residents using the Member Entity's website, resident newsletter, or other methods of communication controlled by the Member Entity or the County of El Paso.

**16. No Indemnification.** The Parties agree that no Party will have the right to seek indemnification or contribution from any other Party for any losses, costs, expenses, or damages arising from this Agreement. Each Party must handle any claims resulting from their actions in this Agreement. Each Party agrees that each will be responsible for the acts or omissions of its respective representatives.

### 17. General Provisions.

- **A.** No Waiver. A Party may waive any default without waiving any prior or subsequent defaults. A Party's failure to exercise or delay in exercising any right under this Agreement will not operate as a waiver of such right.
- **B.** Independent Contractor Relationship. This Agreement does not create an employee-employer relationship among the Parties. As such, any Party is not subject to the liabilities or obligations another Party obtains under the performance of this Agreement.
- C. Time is of the Essence. Time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement.
- **D.** Confidentiality. The Parties acknowledge that this Agreement is subject to Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code (Texas Public Information Act). The release of the Agreement as a whole or in part must comply with Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code (Texas Public Information Act).
- **E.** Governing Law. Texas law governs this Agreement.
- **F. Venue.** The venue for disputes regarding this Agreement among the Parties will be El Paso County, Texas.
- **G. Severability.** A future finding of invalidity of any provision of this Agreement does not affect the validity of any remaining provisions of this Agreement.
- **H. Headings.** The headings and subheadings of this Agreement are for information purposes only and are not substantive terms.

- I. Compliance with the Laws. The Parties will comply with all applicable laws, administrative orders, and any rules or regulations relating to the obligations under this Agreement.
- J. Force Majeure. There is no breach of contract should any Party's obligations within this Agreement be delayed due to an act of God, outbreak of hostilities, riot, civil disturbance, acts of terrorism, the act of any government or authority, fire, explosion, flood, theft, malicious damage, strike, lockout, or any cause or circumstances whatsoever beyond any Party's reasonable control. The delayed Party must resume performing its obligations in this Agreement after the reason for the delay is resolved.
- **K.** Successors and Assigns. This Agreement is binding on the Parties and the Parties' successors and assigns. No Party may assign, sublet, or transfer its interest or obligations in this Agreement without the written consent of the other Parties.
- L. Third-Party Beneficiaries. There are no third-party beneficiaries for this Agreement.
- **M. Provisions Surviving this Agreement.** Representations, releases, warranties, covenants, indemnities, and confidentiality survive past the execution, performance, and termination of this Agreement.

**Representations and Warranties.** Each of the persons executing this Agreement on behalf of any Parties hereby represents and warrants that they have full and complete authority to sign on behalf of their respective Party.

**N. Amendments.** This Agreement may be amended at any time by written instruments executed by the authorized officials of the Parties.

#### **EXHIBIT A**

#### **SERVICE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023**

### County Bus FY2023 Service Plan

Service changes in FY2023 will be implemented in four phases, listed below. All services will be implemented as traditional, fixed-route County Bus service and will not contain any flexible-route service, general public demand response service, or Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) paratransit service. Future service changes beyond FY2023 will likely implement some or all of these additional services.

- Start of FY (October 1, 2022).
  - o EPCT implemented Routes 30 and 31 on September 1, 2022, with proposed service levels, including Sunday service on both routes. Note that, effective early November 2022, EPCT will be altering the level of service and alignment of Routes 30 and 31 due to concerns raised by the communities served by those routes. For simplicity, TTI assumed that the November 2022 service levels and alignments have been in place since the beginning of the fiscal year (October 1, 2022).
  - o Sunday service restarts on Route 50 (using its current alignment).
  - o All other routes continue current service.
- January 9, 2023:
  - o Route 20 will be shortened to terminate at Far East Transit Center.
    - Weekday service span and headways will remain the same.
    - No Sunday service.
    - Due to low demand and having a shorter route, Saturday service headways will increase from 50 minutes to 90 minutes, reducing the vehicle requirement to one vehicle.
  - All other routes continue service.
- March 6, 2023:
  - o Routes 40 and 40X will be implemented with proposed service levels, including Sunday service on the 40 *only* (not the 40X).
  - o All other routes continue service.
- July 31, 2023:
  - o Routes 10 and 11 will be implemented with proposed service levels, including Sunday service on both routes.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Phase 1 and Phase 2 plans, created by TTI, all recommend the implementation of flexible-route service and of general-public dial-a-ride service, meeting EPCT's obligations under the ADA. The FY2023 service changes do not include these service offerings; however, these services should be able to be implemented within the next two fiscal years.

o All other routes continue service.

Summaries of the weekday, Saturday, and Sunday services by route are shown in Table 1, Table 2, and Table 3, respectively. Service plan detail can also be found in Attachment 2. Table 4 contains an overall summary of the FY2023 service changes compared to pre-FY2023 services. The tables contain several transit terms, which are defined below:

- Span: refers to the hours of operation for a route—essentially the times when the route "opens" and "closes" for business.
- Approx. Headway: refers to the average number of minutes between buses during the day and time period in question.
- Approx. Cycle Time: refers to the average amount of time it will take for a bus to complete a round trip on the route. The cycle times shown include driving time plus estimated time boarding passengers but do not include recovery time, which is included in the overall route's schedule in Attachment 2.
- Round Trips: refers to the number of round trips buses on the route will make in a given day.
- Revenue Service Totals: refers to the daily total revenue hours and miles operated by buses on the route in a given day.
- Peak Vehicles: refers to the number of buses needed at peak operation of the route. (Does not include spare buses needed in the fleet to accommodate maintenance.)

The service changes implemented in FY2023 will result in a substantial increase in weekly service—especially weekday and Sunday service. Weekday service will increase by 84 percent, from 103 daily hours of service to 190 daily hours of service. Sunday service will increase by 252 percent, from 16 Sunday hours of service to 56. The number of peak vehicles needed to operate service will also increase from 7 to 16 (excluding spare vehicles).

Of course, the service changes will not happen instantly but instead will occur in phases as described at the beginning of this section. To forecast the total number of revenue hours and miles per route, TTI used the daily revenue hours and miles data contained in Table 1, Table 2, and Table 3 and then determined the number of weekdays, Saturdays, and Sundays that each route would operate during each month of the fiscal year. Table 5 displays the total FY2023 forecasted revenue hours and miles for each route. (The full revenue hours and miles calculator is available in Attachment 1.) The total revenue hours (49,718) in FY2023 will be a 47% increase over FY2021 County Bus revenue hours (33,804<sup>2</sup>).

#### BYLAWS OF EL PASO AREA TRANSPORTATION SERVICE, LGC

#### ARTICLE I PURPOSES

El Paso Area Transportation Service, LGC (the "Corporation") is organized for the purpose of encouraging and assisting local units of government to join and cooperate with one another to provide and deliver regional multimodal transportation solutions for the residents of the Greater El Paso community.

The Corporation shall have and exercise all of the rights, powers, privileges, authority, and functions given by the general laws of the State of Texas to non-profit corporations incorporated under the Local Government Corporation Act, including, without limitation, the Texas Transportation Code Section 431.01, *et seq.*, the Texas Nonprofit Corporation Law, Chapter 22, Business Organizations Code, Section 22.001, *et seq.* 

The Corporation shall not create a legal obligation for any Members, as defined in Article 3 or local units of government that are a Member of the Corporation ("Local Government Units") save and except with the express consent of a Member or Local Government Unit. The Corporation shall comply, when applicable, with all Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") requirements.

The Corporation shall have the power to acquire real property, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. The Corporation may, except as prohibited in any interlocal agreement with a Local Government Unit, contract with any qualified and appropriate person, association, corporation or governmental entity to acquire personal property or to perform and discharge designated tasks which will aid or assist the Corporation in the performance of its duties.

The Corporation shall have the power to accept any contribution or donation from any source and shall have the power to request and accept any appropriation, grant, or other form of aid from the federal government or the State or from any other source.

## ARTICLE II AUTHORITY AND DUTIES OF THE CORPORATION

**Section 2.01. Board Functions and Authority.** In order to accomplish its objectives and purposes, the Board of Directors shall perform the following functions:

- a. Adopt and revise the Bylaws of the Corporation.
- b. Elect Corporation Officers.
- c. Adopt an Annual Budget.

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In addition to the above functions, the Board of Directors has the authority to:

- 1. Prepare periodic reports as may be required by the Bylaws of the Corporation and Federal and State legislation or regulations.
- 2. Receive and expend gifts, contributions, and donations which may be made to the Corporation to accomplish its purposes.
- 3. Apply and contract for, receive and expend for Corporation purposes, funds or grants from the State of Texas, the Federal Government, or any other source.
- 4. Receive and expend funds from Corporation Members, as provided in these Bylaws, to finance the cost of operations, except that the Corporation shall not have the authority to levy taxes of any kind.
- 5. Coordinate and assist in planning and development for countywide public transit and provide assistance to Local Government Units in the implementation of their planning.

#### ARTICLE III MEMBERS

Eligible governmental units within El Paso County may become members of the Corporation by passage of an ordinance, minute order, resolution or other appropriate and legal action of the governing body of such governmental units adopting these Bylaws and appropriating the funds required to pay their share of the dues of the Corporation as set forth by Article VII of these Bylaws.

Governmental units eligible to become members of the Corporation shall be:

- 1. Incorporated cities and towns.
- 2. Independent and Common School Districts, and Junior College Districts.

A member of the Council may, by ordinance, minute order, resolution or other appropriate and legal action of that governing body, withdraw from the Corporation. Governmental units which withdraw from the Council may subsequently apply for readmission as new members. In the event of withdrawal by a member of the Council, said member shall not be entitled to a return of any portion of previously paid annual dues.

Advisory membership in the Corporation may be permitted by action of the Board of Directors. In no event shall advisory membership entitle voting representation or voice in the governing body of the Corporation.

#### ARTICLE IV DIRECTORS

**Section 4.01. Board of Directors.** All powers of the Corporation shall be vested in the Board of Directors (the "Board"). The Board shall consist of five (5) persons. Each Local Government Unit member shall have one (1) Director whom shall by appointed by that Local Government Unit by an ordinance, minute order, resolution or other appropriate and legal action of that governing body. Additionally, the County shall appoint the Chair of the Board and shall

unilaterally adopt the appropriate criteria for serving in that capacity. Any Members added, in accordance with Article III of these bylaws and excluding advisory membership, shall be entitled to appoint an additional Director to represent their member agency on the Board.

Each Director, with exception of the Chair, must be an employee or contracted consultant of the appointing Local Government Unit. Additionally, the Director shall not be a member of the Local Government Unit's governing body. Any Director may be removed from office at any time, with or without cause, by the Local Government Unit which appointed that Director.

At the first annual meeting, the Directors shall be divided into three equal groups and designated by the Board to serve one, two, or three year terms. Thereafter, the term of office of each Director shall be two years. Each Director, including a Director elected to fill a vacancy, shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which he or she was elected and until the election and qualification of a successor, or until that Director's earlier resignation or removal in accordance with these Bylaws. Upon the expiration of the term of office of any such Director appointed by resolution of the appointing Local Government Unit, or upon removal or resignation of such Direction, the applicable Local Government Unit shall appoint a successor Director, and the term of office for each such successor Director shall also be two (2) years. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Bylaws, each Director serves at the pleasure of Corporation. The removal of any Director shall be for cause, and shall be by a majority vote of the entire Board.

To the extent allowed under Tex. Const. art. XVI, §17 (Officers to Serve Until Successors Qualified), in the event that a Director resigns, is removed or, is separated from his or her employment by their appointing Local Government Unit or, otherwise is no longer qualified to serve as a Director, then such Director shall be considered removed from the Board of Directors and the Member or Local Government Unit that appointed the Director shall provide for the appointment of a new Director to complete the unexpired term of such Director.

Any Director or officer may resign at any time. Such resignations shall be made in writing and shall take effect at the time specified therein, or, if no time be specified, at the time of its receipt by the Chair or Secretary. The acceptance of a resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective, unless expressly so provided in the resignation.

Vacancies on the Board shall be filled by the Member or Local Government Unit affiliated with that vacancy. An interim appointment may be made by the Member or Local Government Unit affiliated with that vacancy.

**Section 4.02. Meetings of Directors.** The Directors may hold their meetings and may have an office and keep the books of the Corporation at such place or places as the Board may

from time to time determine: provided, however, in the absence of any such determination, such places shall be the registered office of the Corporation in the State of Texas.

The Board and any committee of the Board exercising the powers of the Board shall meet in accordance with and file notices of each meeting of the Board as is required by Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code (the "Open Meetings Act").

**Section 4.03. Annual Meetings.** The first regular meeting of the Board following the start of each federal fiscal year shall be the Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting shall be held at the registered office of the Corporation and shall be for the purpose of transacting such business as may be brought before the meeting.

**Section 4.04. Regular Meetings.** Regular meetings of the Board shall be held at such times and places as shall be designated, four times per year, by a resolution of the Board.

**Section 4.05. Special Meetings.** Special meetings of the Board shall be held whenever called by the Chair of the Board or by a majority of the Directors and shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act.

Each Director shall be given reasonable notice of each Special Meeting in person by telephone, electronic transmission (e.g., facsimile transmission or electronic mail) or mail at least seventy-two (72) hours before the meeting. Unless otherwise indicated in the notice thereof, any and all matters pertaining to the purposes of the Corporation may be considered and acted upon at a Special Meeting.

**Section 4.06. Quorum.** A majority of the Board (which must include an El Paso County Director) shall constitute a quorum for the consideration of matters pertaining to the purposes of the Corporation. The act of a majority of the Directors present (which must include an El Paso County Director) and voting at a meeting at which a quorum is in attendance shall constitute the act of the Board. The Board of Directors shall exercise a one person-one vote policy for the membership that he or she represents. The Chair shall only exercise voting privileges in the event of a tie or as explicitly required by these Bylaws.

The affirmative votes of all six Directors shall be required to approve the following:

- 1. The amendment of the Articles of Incorporation;
- 2. The amendment of these Bylaws

A proposal to alter, amend, or repeal these Bylaws shall be made by the affirmative vote of all the Directors at any annual or regular meeting, or at any special meeting if notice of the proposed amendment be contained in the notice of said special meeting. However, any proposed change or

amendment to the Bylaws must be approved by the El Paso County Commissioners Court to be effective.

**Section 4.07. Conduct of Business.** At the meetings of the Board, matters pertaining to the purposes of the Corporation shall be considered in such order as from time to time the Board may determine.

At all meetings of the Board, the Chair shall preside, and in the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall preside. In the absence of the Chair and the Vice-Chair, an acting presiding officer shall be chosen by the Board from among the Directors present.

The Secretary of the Corporation shall act as secretary of all meetings of the Board, but in the absence of the Secretary, the presiding officer may appoint any person to act as secretary of the meeting. The Secretary of the Corporation shall be a member of be of the El Paso County staff.

- Section 4.08. Compensation of Directors; Reimbursement for Expenses. Directors shall not receive any salary or compensation for their services as Directors. Directors shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as Directors.
- **Section 4.09. Director's Liability.** No Director shall be liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for an act or mission in the Director's capacity as a Director, except as is authorized by Texas or Federal law for public officials of a Texas governmental entity.
- **Section 4.10. Director's Reliance on Consultant Information.** Unless there is an established rule of law to the contrary, a Director shall not be liable if while acting in good faith and with ordinary care, the Director relies on information, opinions, reports, or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, concerning the Corporation or another person that were prepared or presented by:
- (a) one or more officers or Directors of the Corporation or employees of the Members or Local Government Units; or
- (b) legal counsel, public accountants, or other persons as to matter the Director reasonably believes are within the person's professional or expert competence.

#### ARTICLE V OFFICERS

**Section 5.01. Titles and Term of Office.** The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chair, a Vice-Chair, and other officers as the Board may from elect at the annual meeting. The initial term of the officers of the Corporation shall be two (2) years.

Any vacancy in the office of an officer shall be filled by a majority vote of the Board.

Section 5.02. Powers and Duties of the Chair. The Chair shall be appointed by the County Commissioners Court, will act as the principal executive officer of the Corporation and shall be in general charge of the properties and affairs of the Corporation. In furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation and subject to the limitations contained in the Articles of Incorporation, the Chair or the Vice-Chair may sign and execute all bonds, notes, deeds, conveyances, franchises, assignments, mortgages, notes, contracts and other obligations in the name of the Corporation. The Chair shall have such other duties as are assigned by the Board. The Chair may call special meetings of the Board.

Section 5.03. Powers and Duties of the Vice-Chair. The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair upon the Chair's death, absence, disability, or resignation, or upon the Chair's inability to perform the duties of his or her office. Any action taken by the Vice-Chair in the performance of the duties of the Chair shall be conclusive evidence of the absence or inability to act of the Chair at the time such action was taken. The Vice-Chair shall have such other powers and duties as may be assigned to him or her by the Board or the Chair.

Section 5.04. Compensation and Staff. Officers are not entitled to compensation.

**Section 5.05. Officer's Liability.** No officer shall be liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for an act or omission in the officer's capacity as an officer, except as is authorized by Texas or Federal law for public officials of a Texas governmental entity.

Section 5.06. Officer's Reliance on Consultant Information. Unless there is an established rule of law to the contrary, an officer shall not be liable if while acting in good faith and with ordinary care, the officer relies on information, opinions, reports, or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, concerning the Corporation or another person that were prepared or presented by:

- (a) one or more other officers or Directors of the Corporation or employees of the Members or Local Government Units; or
- (b) legal counsel, public accountants, or other persons as to matters the officer reasonably believes are within the person's professional or expert competence.

**Section 5.07. Removal from Office.** Any officer may be removed from office at any time, with or without cause, by the Board of Directors.

**Section 5.8. Non-Officer Staff.** Staff functions for the Corporation may be performed by El Paso County staff and the Corporation shall pay costs for such services as from time to time shall be billed to the Corporation by El Paso County. The staff functions shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Secretary The Secretary shall keep or cause to be kept the minutes of all meetings of the Board in books provided for that purpose and he or she shall attend to the giving and serving of all notices. He or she shall have charge of the Corporation's books, records, documents and instruments, except the books of account and financial records and securities of which the Treasurer shall have custody and charge, and such other books and papers as the Board may direct, all of which shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any Director upon application at the office of the Corporation during business hours and he or she shall, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary subject to the control of the Board.
- Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have custody of all the funds and securities of the Corporation which come into his or her hands. When necessary or proper, he or she may endorse, on behalf of the Corporation, for collection, checks, notes and other obligations and shall deposit the same to the credit of the Corporation in such bank or banks or depositories as shall be designated in the manner prescribed by the Board; he or she may sign all receipts and vouchers for payments made to the Corporation, either alone or jointly with such other officer as is designated by the Board; whenever required by the Board, he or she shall render a statement of his or her cash account; he or she shall enter or cause to be entered regularly in the books of the Corporation to be kept by him or her for that purpose full and accurate accounts of all moneys received and paid out on account of the Corporation; and he or she shall perform all acts incident to the position of Treasurer subject to the control of the Board.

#### ARTICLE VI BUDGET AND FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall commence on October 1 of each year and end on September 30 of the following year. By the first Monday in October of each year, the Board shall prepare and adopt a proposed budget of expected revenues and proposed expenditures for the next ensuing fiscal year. The budget shall be considered adopted upon formal approval of the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VII FINANCE

**Section 7.01. Member Annual Dues.** Upon recommendation of the Board of Directors, annual dues of the Members for the next ensuing fiscal year shall be adopted at the Annual Board of Directors Meeting in July of each year. This action shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the voting representatives present and is tied directly to the implementation of County transit

expansion. This action shall require membership dues to become due and payable on January 1 of each year. An eligible Local Government Unit joining the Corporation during the year shall have its annual dues prorated to the nearest beginning month for the remainder of the fiscal year. A Member that is more than six months in arrears in its dues as set forth in Section A of this Article may be denied its voting privileges by action of the Executive Committee until such time as dues are paid. A member which is more than one year in arrears in its dues may be expelled by action of the Executive Committee. To allow for further project development and collaboration, additional funds may be pledged by a Local Government Unit to the Corporation for a specific project or purpose upon approval of the Board. These projects are not subject to the payment deadlines or requirements otherwise established by this Article as they are tied to project milestones and other relevant deadlines.

**Section 7.02.** Corporation Funds. Funds of the Corporation shall be deposited in a depository to be designated at least every five (5) years by the Board of Directors. Funds may be expended only for budgeted items approved by the Board of Directors. Payments are to be made subject to the [Financial Policies and Procurement Policies], as adopted or revised by the Board of Directors.

**Section 7.03. Corporation Fiscal Year.** The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be October 1 through September 30 of the following year.

# ARTICLE VIII AUDIT AND ANNUAL REPORT

The Corporation shall have an annual audit performed by a qualified independent auditor or auditing firm. This audit shall be performed as soon after the conclusion of the Corporation's fiscal year as applicable and reflect the financial accounts and transactions of the preceding fiscal year.

Following the conclusion of each fiscal year, the Corporation shall prepare and present an annual report to each Local Governmental Unit that reflects the activities and progress of the Corporation for the preceding year by April 1. This report shall include a summary budget or financial report and shall be distributed to all Members, all required Stated and Federal Agencies and any other agencies, governmental units or organizations deemed beneficial by this Corporation.

# ARTICLE IX INDEMNIFICATION

**Section 9.01. Indemnification.** Given that the Corporation has been created as a local government corporation pursuant to the LGC Act and therefore is a Texas governmental unit whose operations are all governmental and not proprietary functions for any purposes, to the maximum extent allowed by Texas law for local governmental entities, the Corporation may indemnify current and former directors, officers, and employees ("Indemnified Person") for acts and/or omissions that occur within the scope and course of their duties with the Corporation.

**Section 9.02. Insurance.** The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance, at its expense, to protect itself and any Indemnified Person.

## ARTICLE X CODE OF ETHICS

#### Section 10.01. Policy and Purposes.

- A. It is the policy of the Corporation that Directors and officers conduct themselves in a manner consistent with sound business and ethical practices; that the public interest always be considered in conducting corporate business; that the appearance of impropriety be avoided to ensure and maintain the public confidence in the Corporation; and that the Board establish policies to control and manage the affairs of the Corporation, fairly, impartially, and without discrimination.
- B. This Code of Ethics included in Exhibit A has been adopted as part of the Board's Bylaws for the following purposes: (a) to encourage high ethical standards in official conduct by Directors and corporate officers; and (b) to establish guidelines for such ethical standards of conduct.

**Section 10.02. Unlawful Acts.** In addition to any unethical conduct prohibited by Texas or Federal law and/or regulation for a Texas governmental officer or public official, a Director or officer shall not intentionally or knowingly offer, confer or agree to confer on another, or solicit, or agree to accept from another:

- (a) Any benefit as consideration for the Director or officer's decision, opinion, recommendation, vote, or other exercise of discretion as a Director or officer; or
- (b) Any benefit as consideration for a violation of a duty imposed by law on the Director or officer.

#### ARTICLE XI ALLOCATION OF NET INCOME

To allow for further project development and collaboration, any net income of the Corporation identified at the end of the fiscal year that is not needed to pay Corporation's expenses or obligations may be used by the Corporation for a specific project or purpose upon approval of the Board.

# ARTICLE XII MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 12.01. Notice and Waiver of Notice. Whenever any notice whatever is required to be given under the provisions of these Bylaws, such notice shall be deemed to be sufficient if given by depositing the same in a post office box in a sealed postpaid wrapper addressed to the person entitled thereto at this or her post office address, as it appears on the books of the Corporation, and such notice shall be deemed to have been given on the day of such mailing. A waiver of notice, signed by the person or persons entitled to said notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent thereto.

**Section 12.02. Amendments.** A proposal to alter, amend, or repeal these Bylaws shall be made by the affirmative vote of all the Directors at any annual or regular meeting, or at any special meeting if notice of the proposed amendment be contained in the notice of said special meeting. However, any proposed change or amendment to the Bylaws must be approved by the El Paso County Commissioners Court to be effective.

**Section 12.03. Gender.** References herein to the masculine gender shall also refer to the feminine in all appropriate cases, and vice versa.

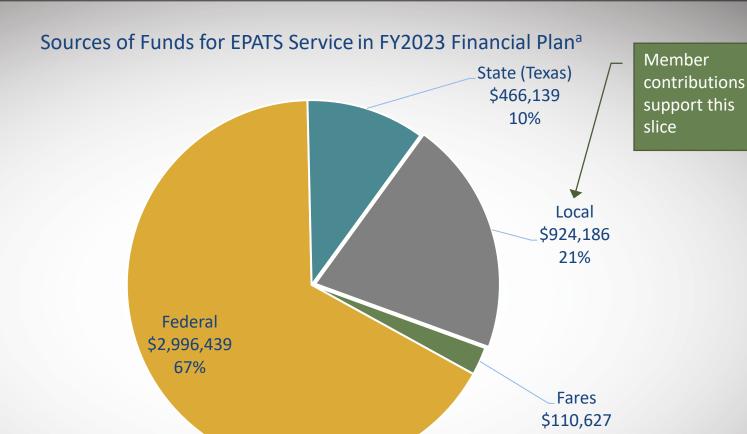

# Why start with revenue?

- Different sources of revenue have limitations and rules for their use
- For example:
  - Federal and state grants will not reimburse certain kinds of costs
  - Federal grants limit what share the federal government will have in certain kinds of costs
- Knowing the rules of revenue sources allows us categorize costs to follow those rules!

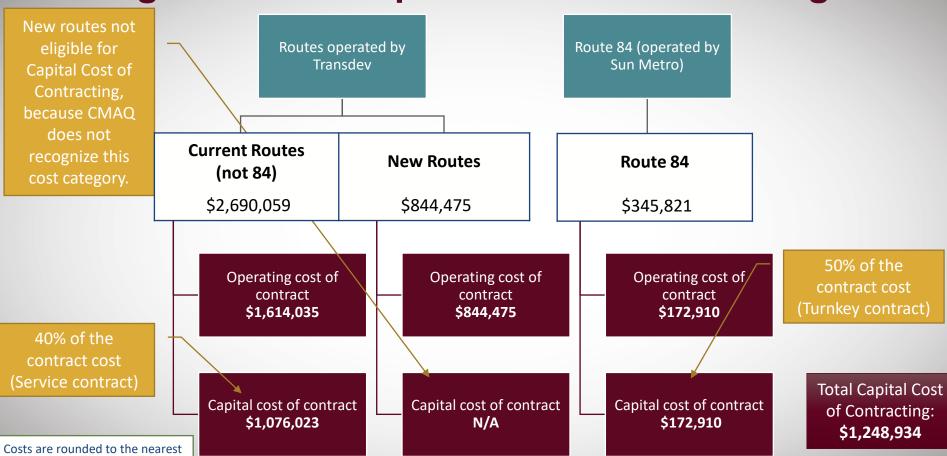

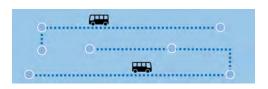

The EPCAD communicates the property taxes due yearly with each business and property owner. In Texas, the inventory ad valorem tax is the only tax that becomes exempt in the Foreign Trade Zone. The other property tax items are still collected as ad valorem taxes annually.

In El Paso County all of the tax entities offer the Texas Freeport Exemption for the assessed value if inventory held within its jurisdictions as of January 1 of each year. The Texas Freeport Exemption applies to inventory that leaves the State of Texas within 175 days of arrival. Material that is held more than 175 days, or doesn't leave the State of Texas within 175 days is subject to the inventory ad valorem tax. The FTZ program exempts the inventory that goes beyond the 175 day limit.

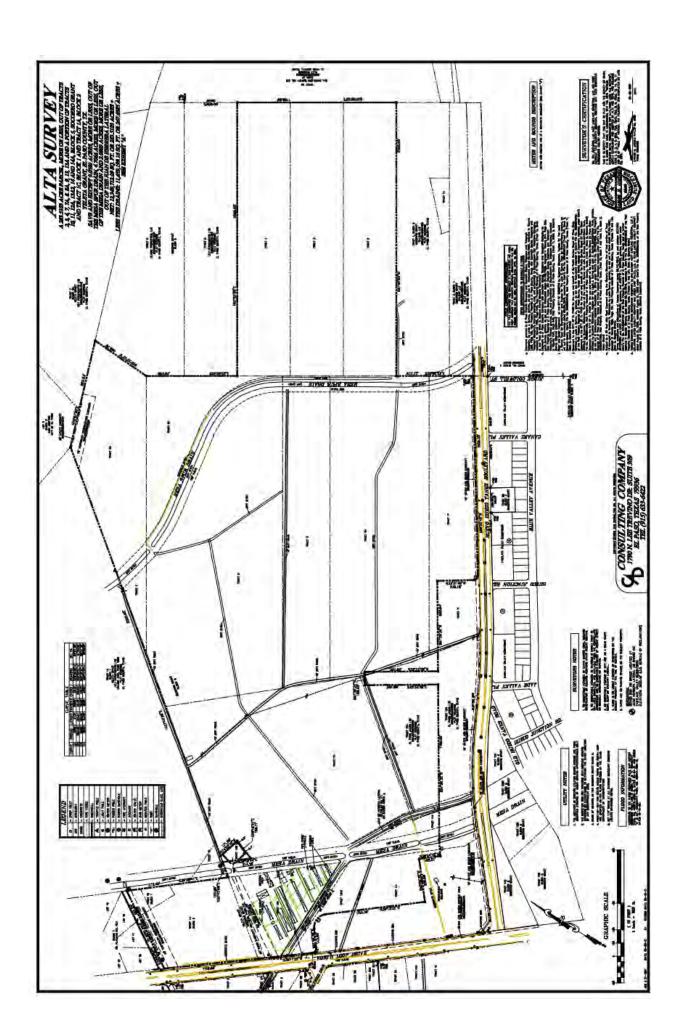

#### CITY OF SOCORRO MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into by and between the CITY OF SOCORRO (the "CITY"), a home rule municipal corporation, and the EL PASO CHAMBER of Commerce MISSION TRAIL ALLIANCE (MTA) on this the 1st day of June, 2023.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Socorro has entered into a "Collaboration Agreement" with the El Paso Chamber of Commerce Mission Trail Alliance; and,

WHEREAS, El Paso County completed the County's Mission Trail Comprehensive Plan in 2019 which focuses on the Mission Valley Historic Trail area and its three distinct communities. The Mission Trail is recognized as a vital part of El Paso's tourism industry and a hub for economic development and historic preservation. The plan presents guidelines and policy recommendations for the preservation, protection, and enhancement of the structures, sites, character, and culture of the Mission Trail Historical area and the surrounding environment along the Camino Real.

**WHEREAS**, the County's Mission Trail Comprehensive Plan called for the creation of an alliance to help coordinate existing funding sources with stakeholders and seek new funding sources. With the support of various entities and non-profits, the El Paso Chamber of Commerce has created the Mission Trail Alliance to accomplish the following goals:

- Make the Ysleta, Socorro, and San Elizario Missions the center of commercial, civic, and cultural activity in their respective communities;
- Manage a special assessment fund aimed at making improvements;
- Form a volunteer Board of Directors comprised of property owners, business representatives, tenants, and community leaders;
- Coordinate a single branded marketing vision for all entities to increase exposure of what the Mission Trail has to offer local visitors as well as, and most important tourists;
- Facilitate beautification grant programs for local property owners and businesses with targeted advertising of façade grant improvements, chain-link fencing replacement grants, and sidewalk repair and installation programs, particularly within 1,000 feet of the missions.;
- Coordinate with the Master Gardener Program to promote best management practices for home gardeners, increase local food production, and enhance the community with plant diversity;
- Implement beautification projects such as plantings, coordinated streetscape furniture, banners, public art, etc.; and
- Advocate for commercial and retail business development to create local jobs, in addition to new agriculture-related jobs.

WHEREAS, the Mission Trail Alliance will include the following entities and organizations: the El Paso Chamber of Commerce, El Paso County, City of El Paso, City of Socorro, City of San Elizario, Ysleta Del Sur Pueblo, Rio Grande Council of Governments, MPO, Paso Del Norte Foundation, TxDot, El Paso Mission Trail Association, Office of Congresswoman Veronica Escobar, and Congressman Tony Gonzales District Office.

- a) The **CITY** and the El Paso Chamber of Commerce **Mission Trail Alliance** will comply with the following terms of the MOU, specifically:
  - i. Work together to promote long-term economic growth for the Mission Trail area utilizing the County's Mission Trail Comprehensive Plan as guidance.
  - ii. Work with the Mission Trail Alliance to seek and apply for funding sources to help improve the Mission Trail area.
  - iii. Work with the Mission Trail Alliance to drive projects and goals for the benefit of the Mission Trail area.

#### b) **PERIOD OF SERVICE / TERM**

i. This MOU will become effective after execution and shall be reviewed as needed for continuation.

#### c)TERMINATION

- i. **TERMINATION BY EITHER PARTY.** It is further understood and agreed by the El Paso Chamber of Commerce Mission Trail Alliance and CITY that either party may terminate this MOU. Such termination may be made for failure of one party to substantially fulfill its contractual obligations, pursuant to this MOU, and through no fault of the other party. No such termination shall be made, unless the other party being terminated is granted: a) written notice of intent to terminate enumerating the failures for which the termination is being sought; b) a minimum of **thirty (30) consecutive calendar days** to cure such failures; and c) an opportunity for consultation with the terminating party prior to such termination.
- ii. Each Party will in good faith negotiate resolution of any commitments or outstanding obligations under this MOU.

ALL PARTIES AGREE THAT THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING IS NOT A CONTRACT AND CREATES NO LEGAL REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE LAW AND IS NOT ENFORCEABLE AS SUCH. THE PURPOSE FOR THIS DOCUMENT IS TO STATE THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CITY OF SOCORRO AND THE EI PASO CHAMBER.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF SOCORRO OF EL PASO COUNTY, TEXAS: That the City of Socorro enters into this Memorandum of Understanding with the El Paso Chamber of Commerce Mission Trail Alliance.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 320, AMENDMENT NO. 3, OF THE CITY OF SOCORRO, AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES AND RULES FOR CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS AND AGENDAS AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 3.08 OF THE SOCORRO CITY CHARTER, AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES AND RULES FOR CONDUCT OF THE SOCORRO CITY COUNCIL AND ALL OF THE CITY OF SOCORRO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 304 AS AMENDED AND ORDINANCE 280 AS AMENDED.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOCORRO, TEXAS, THAT:

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2014, the City adopted its current effective ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Socorro is authorized by Section 3.08 of the City Charter to establish Rules of Procedure for City Council meetings and agendas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously operated under procedures set forth in the original Ordinance 280; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to update and revise these procedures; and

WHEREAS, rules of procedure are necessary, indeed essential, for the proper consideration and deliberation of the Socorro City Council as well as all City Boards and Commissions; and

**WHEREAS**, appropriate deliberation and efficient consideration of the People's business demands that matters be addressed and resolved after appropriate discussion; and

WHEREAS, City Council has determined that certain rules and procedures with respect to the conduct of business at Socorro City Council Meetings are unnecessary, restrictive and do not provide a fair and open forum to conduct the business of the City of Socorro.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council wishes to establish a method for making a record of each closed executive session; and whereas the method the city wishes to use is the making of a certified agenda and not an audio or visual recording;

#### **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SOCORRO, TEXAS, THAT:

# SECTION 1. RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS:

Rules of Procedure for Socorro City Council Meetings are established and adopted as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.

# SECTION 2. RULES OF CONDUCT AND PROCEDURE FOR ALL MEETINGS OF THE SOCORRO CITY COUNCIL AND MEETINGS OF ALL SOCORRO'S BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

#### 1. Rules of Order:

The City Council and all Boards and Commissions of City of Socorro (collectively referred herein as "members") shall observe the parliamentary procedures as found in *Robert's Rules of Order*, Newly Revised, except as otherwise provided in official City procedural rules or by law.

#### 2. Suspension of Rules of Order

Procedural rules may be suspended at any meeting by majority vote of the members present.

# 3. Conduct During Meetings:

Members shall be expected to model the Socorro Code of Ethics and to follow *Robert's Rules of Order*.

If a member violates *Robert's Rules of Order* during a meeting, the following disciplinary procedures shall be enforced:

1. The Presiding Officer or any member shall ask for a recess (not to exceed ten (10) minutes) and the Presiding Officer and/or Second Officer shall confer privately with the offending member. If the offending member is the

Presiding Officer, any member may assume that position for purpose of enforcing this policy.

- 2. If the offending member continues to be in violation, a public warning shall be issued in open meeting by the Presiding Officer or if the Presiding Officer is the offending member by any member.
- 3. If the offending member persists, any member of the Council or Board or Commission may call for public censure and removal of the offending member from that meeting, which shall require a two-thirds vote of the members present.

# **SECTION 3. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES:**

All Ordinances, Orders, or Resolutions of the City of Socorro that are in conflict with the terms of this Ordinance, including specifically Ordinance No. 280 as amended and Ordinance No. 304 as amended are hereby repealed to the extent, and only to the extent, that they conflict with this Ordinance.

# **SECTION 4. SEVERANCE:**

Should any section or part of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, or the application to any person or circumstance for any reasons thereof ineffective or inapplicable, such unconstitutionality, illegality, invalidity, or ineffectiveness of such section or part shall in no way affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining portion or portions thereof; but as to such remaining portion or portions, the same shall be and remain in full.

#### SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY:

This Ordinance shall take effect and be of full force from and after final adoption of same by the City Council of the City of Socorro, Texas.

# PROCEDURES AND RULES FOR CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS AND AGENDAS AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 3.08 OF THE SOCORRO CITY CHARTER.

EXHIBIT "A"

#### I. CALLING MEETINGS

A. Regular and Special Meetings shall be called and notice posted as provided in the Socorro City Charter and the Texas Open Meetings Act.

#### II. AGENDA DEVELOPMENT

- A. The City Clerk is hereby directed to place items on the agenda for meetings of the City Council only in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance.
- B. Unless otherwise provided in this ordinance, the City Clerk shall place on the City Council agenda only those items which are submitted at or before 5:00 p.m. on the Thursday prior to the regular City Council meeting at which discussion or action is requested; and if the request is accompanied by the signature or electronic mail authorization of two (2) council members of the City Council or City Manager.
- C. For Special City Council Meetings, the City Clerk will determine the deadline to place items on the agenda.
- D. All agenda items shall be submitted by members of the City Council in writing on forms supplied by the City Clerk. Agenda item request forms shall be signed by a member of the City Council.
- E. Agenda items for special meetings shall be submitted by a member of the City Council on forms developed and supplied by the City Clerk; and if the request is accompanied by the signature or electronic mail authorization of two (2) council members of the City Council or the City Manager.
- F. The City Manager, City Department Heads and City Attorney, with the approval of the City Manager, may place agenda items on the agenda for any regular or special meeting.
- G. The item requested for the discussion and/or action must be clearly articulated and contain sufficient information. Detailed back-up material is required for routine and non-routine items.
- H. Ceremonial items, including proclamations, will be presented not to exceed one hour. The public comment portion of the agenda will follow, not to exceed thirty minutes.

J. The agenda shall follow the following order once a quorum is established:

#### III. CALLING MEETINGS TO ORDER

- A. Any meeting scheduled and noticed will be convened within fifteen minutes of the time stated in the notice of meeting. This is to allow sufficient time for arrival of members to raise a quorum. After the expiration of fifteen minutes, the presiding officer will either announce that, the waiting time is extended for a specified period not to exceed fifteen (15) minutes, or that the meeting is cancelled for lack of quorum. No business may be conducted and the meeting may not begin until a quorum is present.
- B. Use of electronic devices: Members of the public shall turn off the signals of all pagers, cellular telephones and other devices capable of making an audible signal and shall not make or take any telephone calls while in City Council chambers once a City Council meeting has been called to order.

#### IV. CONDUCT AT MEETINGS

- A. Meeting rooms shall be arranged so that the members of the City Council face the members of the public attending the meeting.
- B. Those attending the meeting shall maintain decorum so as to permit the City's business to be conducted without interruption by applause or vocal interruption by the audience.
- C. Anyone causing a disruption will receive a warning, and upon a second interruption will be removed for the balance of the meeting.
- D. Individuals who continuously interrupt the public meeting and/or commit a breach of the peace may be cited and subjected to criminal penalties.
- E. Personal attacks are not permitted. Members of the public should address their questions to the members of the City Council, not to the staff.

# V. PUBLIC COMMENT

- A. General public comment, known as open forum, will be permitted at all regular and special meetings of the City Council. The maximum time for public comment will be thirty (30) minutes and three minutes will be allotted to each person to speak.
- B. All agenda items are available for public comment and limited to one and a half minutes. Public comment will be taken after the motion is made but before the vote is called. Speakers must sign up in order to speak on any item no later than five minutes before the scheduled commencement of the public meeting for which the item is posted.
- B. Public comment will not be permitted on introduction of any item where a public hearing is called prior to final action on the matter. All public comment on such matters will be reserved for the public hearing on the matter.

#### VI. RECORDING OF CLOSED SESSION

A. The presiding officer must certify that the agenda is a true and correct record of the executive session. The certified agenda must include (1) a statement of the subject matter of each deliberation, (2) a record of any further action taken, and (3) an announcement by the presiding officer at the beginning and the end of the closed meeting indicating the date and time. The agenda does not have to be a verbatim transcript of the meeting, but it must provide a brief summary of each deliberation.

# VII. POSTING OF MEETING VIDEO

No Member of the Socorro City Council, Officer of the City of Socorro or member of the staff of the City of Socorro shall publish or post any recording of the meetings of the Socorro City Council on any internet site, (other than the official Socorro internet site) or social media; including but not limited to youtube or related internet sites.
