



Executive Summary

The primary function of the Grants & Special Projects Department (GSPD) is to assist City Departments and the City's non-profit partner organization in meeting our City's Mission and Vision to better serve the residents of Socorro, Texas. To this end, the GSPD has identified the following department goals:

- Local Government grant funding and program development
- Non-profit sector development and support
- Economic Development program development and support

The GSPD, which is composed of the City Development Director, one (1) full time Grants Accounting Specialists, one (1) Program Officer Compliance Specialist, and one (1) Economic Recovery Coordinator, spearheads new grant projects and special projects across various City departments, the City's nonprofit partner organization, and small business community.

Department Highlights during this reporting period (January 1, 2023 to January 31, 2023) include:

• Capacity Building – Nine (9) training workshops attended by grants department staff on various grants management, grants accounting, grant application preparation, and grant procurement topics during the month of January 2024. Training and onboarding

of new Program Officer Compliance Specialist, Dolores Ayala, was also completed in January 2024.

Grants Writing/ Administration –

- Quarterly Grants Meeting for the Police Department on January 11th, and
 Quarterly Grants Meeting for the Recreation Centers Department on January 16th.
- Preparation and review of quarterly Federal Financial Reports for USDOJ Cops Hiring Grant Program, USDOJ Crisis Intervention Program, FY22 and FY23 West Texas HIDTA Program, for the Police Department and Quarterly Reports for FY22, and FY23 Certified Local Government Program for the Recreation Centers Department.
- Developed and pr five (5) grant applications for the Police Department totaling more than \$172,000 in public safety funding requests to the Office of the Governors.

Special Projects –

- o Administrative support for Sparks Arroyo Drainage Improvement Project funded by the Texas Water Development Board at \$10,097,281 (loan portion \$6,664,000/grant portion \$3,433,281).
- ARPA Continued with Economic Recovery Strategic Plan development as part of ARPA Project GSP07. Continued administrative support to update ARPA Spending Framework per City needs.
- Economic Recovery Coordinated SOCO Breakfast on January 17, 2024, with seventeen (17) attendees from the small business sector. Coordination with Project Vida for VITA Tax Volunteer workshops at EG Chayo Apodaca Community Center.
- Transportation Continued administrative support for TxDOT Transportation projects totaling \$14,063,177.40.




New Grant Awards

There were no new grant awards during this reporting period.

Financial Overview

The following is a general overview of the grant funding available to City Departments since the start of the new 2023-2024 fiscal year on January 1st, 2023. The Active Grants Funding table below represents the <u>net amount</u> of grant funding available to active grant projects since the start of the new 2023-2024 fiscal year. There was no increase or decrease in funding during this reporting period (see Table 2 for details). As of this reporting period, active grant funding awards total <u>\$6,121,884.60</u>. <u>Please note</u> that this active grant total does not include funding awards to the CSCI nonprofit and does not include transportation project funding received for Arterial 1, Nuevo Hueco Tanks Road, or Bovee and Rio Vista Rd. Bridge Replacement Projects. Lastly, although the Texas Transportation Commission did vote to award the City of Socorro \$16,174,505.00 for the Paso del Norte Trail – Socorro Active Transportation Network Project, this amount will not be reported below until an Advance Funding Agreement with TxDOT is in place.

Active Grants

Projects that have been awarded grant funds are listed in Table 1 below. Currently, the GSPD assists City departments with the administration of seventeen (17) grant projects across various departments totaling \$6,121,884.60 in federal, state, or foundation dollars. Please note, although the Texas Transportation Commission did vote to award the City of Socorro \$16,174,505.00 for the Paso del Norte Trail – Socorro Active Transportation Network Project, this project will not be reported below until an Advance Funding Agreement with TxDOT is in place.

ZONING MAP






DEVELOPMENT PLAN








PLAT LOCATION



The Commission is empowered by the Texas Legislature to create rules for the administration of Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, Law Enforcement Officers. Section 1701.162 of the Texas Occupations Code requires that all law enforcement agencies in the state be audited at least once every five (5) years.

Chief administrators are ultimately responsible for the integrity and security of all credentialing and training records entrusted to their agency; and must see to it that all TCOLE-related documents are readily accessible for inspection by TCOLE staff upon request.

Random audits of agency records are intended not only to ensure full compliance with all legislatively mandated requirements; but to appraise chief administrators and/or their designees of changes in administrative rules and TOC statutes. The primary objective of the field inspection program is to proactively help stakeholders achieve full compliance and minimize liability risks. Agency audits help ensure credentialing and training files are accurate, complete and in line with current requirements.

The most recent audit was conducted on September 9, 2021, and showed no deficiencies.

STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE

Agent Shain Burks conducted a TCOLE credentialing file audit on February 8, 2024. This credentialing file audit entailed a verification of firearms qualifications for peace officers in 2023 and 2024 as well as a of any Background Confirmation Form (BCF) after January 1, 2022. The

SUMMARY

The Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) is a state agency created by the 59th Legislature. The Commission is empowered by the Texas Legislature to create rules for the administration of Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, Law Enforcement Officers. Texas Occupations Code 1701.164 specifies that TCOLE Collect incident-based data in accordance with the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure Article 2.131 – 2.138.

Chief Administrators of law enforcement agencies that meet the criteria must submit racial profiling reports to their governing body, as well as TCOLE.

Each agency must file an annual online report by March 1st of the following year.

STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE

On February 21, 2024, the required Racial Profiling Report was completed and submitted by the Socorro Police Department. As required by law the chief administrator of the police department is providing a presentation on the findings of the Racial Profiling Report and supporting documents.

- Racial Profiling Report (SPD Upload)
 - This is the data uploaded into the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Data Distribution System (TCLEDDS). The data entered is complied throughout the year from reports provided after each traffic stop conducted by the officers from the Socorro Police Department.
- Racial Profiling Report (Full)

- o This report details that the Socorro Police Department complies with the law requirements and have the agency has satisfied the statutory data audit requirements prescribed in Article 2.133(c), Code of Criminal Procedure.
- Racial Profiling Report (Analysis)
 - o This is the analytical report completed by TCOLE of the data provided by the Socorro Police Department.
- Socorro Police Department Racial Profiling Presentation
 - o The presentation by the Chief of Police shows the review and analysis of the Racial Profiling Data. In that review the Socorro Police Department showed no substantial change in comparison to previous years (2021 and 2022).





Location of Stop & Race Known (Prior to Stop)






















- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the <u>SOCORRO</u> <u>POLICE DEPARTMENT</u> who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the <u>SOCORRO POLICE DEPARTMENT</u> policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - a. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual:
 - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
 - e. the location of the stop;
 - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

The <u>SOCORRO POLICE DEPARTMENT</u> has satisfied the statutory data audit requirements as prescribed in Article

2.133(c), Code of Criminal Procedure during the reporting period.


